

The Mercy Psalm

The second book of Samuel tells of the great sin King David committed when he had one of his soldiers purposely slain in battle so he could take the man's wife for his own.

Speaking through the prophet Nathan, God told David: "You have done this deed in secret, but I will bring it about in the presence of all Israel, and with the sun looking down." [2 SM 12:12]

David confessed his crime aloud to the prophet Nathan, who answered: "The Lord has forgiven your sin; you

shall not die."

During this Jubilee Year of Mercy, we treasure in a special way the repentant King David's beautiful Psalm 103, which expresses his acceptance and gratitude for God's mercy:

The Lord is compassion and kindness, full of patience, full of mercy.

He does not treat us as our sins deserve; he does not pay us back for our wrongdoing.

As high as the sky above the earth, so great is his kindness to those who revere him.

As far as east is from west, so far he has put our wrongdoing from us.

Our prayer today: *Divine God of Mercy, help us always remember that*

you care for us as a mother cares for her children, even when we least deserve it.

Properly Receiving Holy Communion

When approaching to receive Holy Communion, do not be afraid to approach the Priest. Father's arms are only so long and when you stand too far away, it is difficult to distribute Holy Communion.

We also remind everyone to tilt your head back and open your mouth WIDE. Please keep your tongue in your mouth. Please do not bite down on the communion spoon. There is no need to

say anything since the priest says the prayer. There is no need to say AMEN as is done in the Roman Catholic Church.

Now finally, a little about the red Communion Cloth. Sometimes the Altar Servers hold it; sometimes Father holds it. When the Altar Servers hold, simply approach (i.e., come close to the Priest). If Father is holding it, simply lift it up to your chin. The purpose of the Communion Cloth is to help prevent accidents.

Children Always Welcome in Church

Taking a child he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it Jesus said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the one who sent me." Mark 9:36-37. Let us always joyfully welcome and receive children into our parish, for in

receiving them we receive God himself among us. A reminder to parents: **ALL CHILDREN are to receive Holy Communion when they are present at Divine Liturgy -- this is being practiced throughout our Archeparchy.** Please don't deny your children the Body and Blood of Christ!

Choked by Earthly Cares

Like man, this "great and honored being," as he was called by Scripture, falling from his own worthiness like those who slip and fall into the mud and, having smeared themselves with mire, become unrecognizable even to their companions, so the one who falls into the mire of sin no longer is the image of the incorruptible God, and he is covered through sin with a corruptible and slimy form which reason advises him to reject. However, if, purged by the water, so to speak, of his way of life, the earthly covering can be stripped off, the beauty of the soul may reappear again. The rejection of what is alien means a return to what is proper and natural to oneself, but this is not possible to achieve, unless one be created anew. For, being like the divine is not our function, nor is it the product of human ability, but it is part of the generosity of God who freely, at the birth of the first man, gave our

nature a likeness to himself.

The human effort extends only to this: the removal of the filth which has accumulated through evil and the bringing to light again the beauty in the soul which we had covered over. It is such a dogma that I think the Lord is teaching in the Gospel to those who are able to hear wisdom when it is mysteriously spoken: "The kingdom of God is within you." This saying shows, I believe, that the goodness of God is not separated from our nature, or far away from those who choose to seek it, but it is ever present in each individual, unknown, and forgotten when one is choked by the cares and pleasures of life, but discovered again when we turn our attention back to it.
