The Colors of the Seasons

For Catholics, the colors of the liturgical season of Advent are purple and a little bit of pink. These colors have special significance for this holy season. Purple conveys the theme of repentance and fasting in preparation for the celebration of Christmas.

During Advent, the priest at our Sunday Masses will wear purple vestments on the first, second, and fourth Sundays of Ad-

vent. As in Lent purple reminds us that we are all sinners in need of God's mercy and love.

The third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin. We rejoice in the praise of redemption through the sacrifice of Jesus. On that day the priest wears pink or rose vestments. It's a good reminder that while joy fills our plans for Christmas gift-buying

and gift-giving, the true joy of Christmas is welcoming God's only Son into our world.

The white of Christmas vestments is a sign of the purity of Christ, the sinless one. The priest will wear white vestments on Christmas Day and all Masses through the feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

Set aside some time this Advent for repentance and prayer to enhance your celebration of the birth of the Lord.

Prepare the Way of the Lord

All St. Thomas More families with children in grades preschool through 5th grade including Religious Education students are invited to attend a spe-

cial evening to make us ready for Advent. There will be a prayer, song, and activities. Become a part of the "Living Advent Story". This event takes place

on December 2nd from 5:30 to 7:30 pm in the social hall. Supper will be available for \$2 per person at 5:30 pm. The program begins at 6:00 pm.



RCIA Candidates Look Forward to Advent and the Next Step

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults), is a very formal name for a process that simply is a sharing of faith information and life experiences about the Catholic faith for those interested in becoming Catholic, or for those who have been baptized Catholic, but have never been catechized and have never received their First Communion or been confirmed.

Since the first part of September, we have again been partnering with Candidates from Holy Cross for weekly sessions where the Candidates have heard talks about the Catholic faith, which include the personal lived experi-

ence of the presenter, have taken part in small group discussions, and have been introduced to special prayer services chosen especially for the evening. In all, 9 Candidates are taking part in the process, along with their significant others and sponsors.

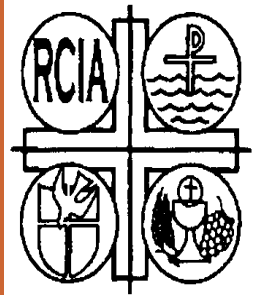
The process is divided into three phases. At the end of each phase, a ceremony is held at a scheduled Mass where in the Candidates publicly state that they wish to proceed to the next phase. As we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent, we look back on the growth we have already seen in the Candidates as they've been

introduced to the basic truths of our faith stated in the Creed, Scripture, the Mass, prayer, and the rosary. On December 8, the Candidates will publically state their desire to continue to go forward.

Advent is a time of expectation and promise and as we approach this special time of year in our faith, we see the weekly desire to learn and expectation on the part of the Candidates as their eyes are being opened to the richness of our faith. We celebrate with them all that has been taking place and look forward to all that they have yet to experience.

We welcome new adorers Susan Krupicka, Lynn Dukich, and Stephanie Sheridan. We currently have 188 adorers and 40 substitutes.

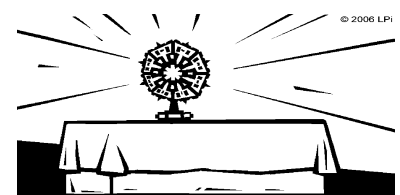
February 17, 2015, will mark the 25th anniversary for Perpetual Adoration at St. Thomas More. We are planning

Please consider taking an hour of adoration or be a substitute. Jesus would like to have a personal relationship

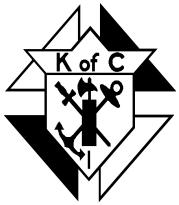

The STM Knights of Columbus Council began in the Fall of 1989 so we are now celebrating our 25th anniversary. Would you like to join us and help us accomplish even more for our parish and community? Pope Francis proclaims the year beginning with the First Sunday of Advent, November 30, 2014 and ending on the World Day of Consecrated Life, February 2, 2016 as the Year of Consecrated Life.

The STM Knights are dedicated to works of charity and to the support of our church, school, and community. This is evident in the various types of activities we undertake throughout the year. Here are some examples:

- * Red Cross Blood drives are held twice a year. This past August the drive brought in 22 units of blood. Our next drive is scheduled for Monday, December 29. Since these blood drives began back in 1998 we have collected a total of 818 units of blood.
- * Our annual Tootsie Roll drive to help people with intellectual disabilities was conducted in October. That drive brought in a little over \$1500. We anticipate collecting some additional donations by offering our remaining Tootsie Rolls at the Parish Dinner and Peddler's Mar-

ket. At those two events we will also help our parish with the sale of the raffle calendars.

- * Lately we have been trying to hold a pancake breakfast near the start of the school year and another around Valentine's Day. The profit from these breakfasts goes toward the scholarships we award at the eighth grade graduation in May. Our next breakfast is February 15.

* We conduct a substance abuse poster contest for the STM students to emphasize the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse. We present scrip certificate awards to the winning entries in this contest.

- * Each January our council's free throw contest is held for STM students. The upcoming contest is scheduled for Sunday, January 4, 2015. The winners from our council's competition go on to com-

pete in further competitions.

- * The Knights of Columbus are strongly pro-life. In line with this commitment we conduct two pro-life collections. The One Rose One Life collection is planned for the weekend Masses on January 17 and 18. During January and February we also conduct the Buck-a-Month program to collect additional pro-life money.

Our social activities include a Knights and Wives Dinner in January which is being held at Eddie's in South Omaha. We always enjoy a great meal there in the company of our Borthers Knights and Wives. This past October we had our annual Corporate Communion at the 9:30 Mass which was followed by a brunch in the Social Hall for our families.

Nationwide 546 babies were saved from abortion. Since the beginning of the 40 Day for Life campaign, 59 abortion clinics have closed and 107 workers have quit. About 10 people from STM prayed on the October 4 Life Chain at 72nd and Dodge.

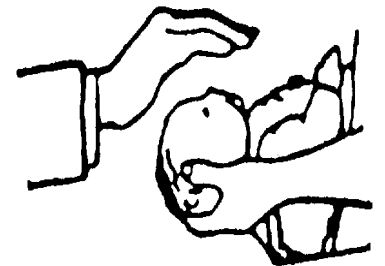

What is a Novena?

Novena in Latin means nine. A Novena is a nine day period, or any lengthy series, of private or public prayer to obtain special graces, to implore special favors, or to make special petitions. There are numerous novenas for different events, petitions, or invoking various saints or causes.

Some examples of Novenas you can say during the next couple of months are:
**A Novena for the Immaculate Conception which would begin 9 days before the Feast of the Immaculate Conception to end on December 8th.

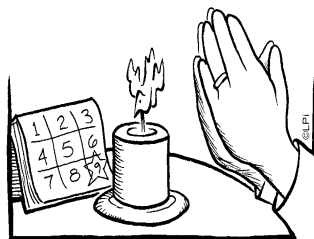
**The Christmas Novena would begin 9 days before

Christmas to end on December 25th.

**The Holy Family Novena would begin 9 days before the Feast of the Holy Family to end on December 28th.

**The Novena for Epiphany would begin 9 days before the Feast of the Epiphany to end on January 4, 2015.

**It is also appropriate to pray the Novena for the Protection of the Unborn from January 14 and end-



ing on January 22, 2015 which is the anniversary of Roe v. Wade.

Also, don't forget about the Novena for Life that Adorers will be praying from December 4 through December 12.

Spend some time in prayer this Advent and take a break from all the "busyness" of preparations. It's a great New Year's resolution to do also!
