

Pope Francis Lesson 7 Rejoice! (April)



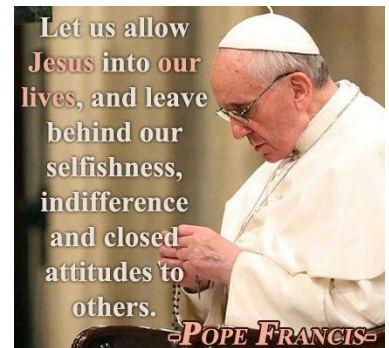
