...TO THE POINT OF DEATH

This week we enter the holiest of all weeks in the church year. As the followers of Christ, we are invited again to dive deeply into the mystery that saves us, the mystery of the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Next week we celebrate Easter, but we cannot get to Easter without Good Friday. We don't get to smell the lilies until we

get pricked by the thorns.

St. Paul shares a reflection on this mystery with us in his letter to the Philippians. In what is regarded as a hymn, he rejoices in the self-emptying of God in Christ, whose ongoing poverty did not end until the most humiliating of deaths. Therefore, Jesus is with us at all moments of our own human experiences, even and most especially at the point of our own death.

Two years ago, a few weeks after Fr. William was killed, I accompanied a small group of our young people through the rectory. They asked if they could take with them a small token or reminder of the place, if they found something

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that struck them, and I said it would be alright as long as they showed me first. One young man came upon a small canister, and when he showed it to me, I realized it was a pyx — the small metal contained for carrying the Eucharist when visiting the sick. The day before Fr. William died was First Friday, and he had visited with a number of our homebound parishioners. When I held that pyx, I heard a rattling sound and realized that there were still a few hosts in it — the Body of Christ, burned.

Just the Body of Christ, present in Fr. William, also was burned. Fr. Willy died with his Eucharistic Lord present only a couple feet away. "Stay with us, Lord..."

For the past two years, that pyx and the Eucharist within have remained in the tabernacle in the convent chapel. I just didn't know what to do with it. Last week Monday, I gave a talk at the Conversion of St. Paul Shrine on the topic of St. Francis and the Eucharist. Since the Capuchin Franciscans staff the shrine, and the Poor Clare nuns maintain a ministry of perpetual Eucharistic adoration, it seemed fitting to bring Fr. William's pyx and the Eucharist to the prayerful discernment of those in that holy place.

In a very moving gesture, Fr. Phil led a prayerful and simple act of adoration, after which he presented the cloistered nuns with the pyx that he called a "sacred relic." We promised that we would pray with each other and ask the Lord to help us discern the right thing to do. After a couple of days, Mother Abess called to say that the Lord revealed to the nuns that they should consume the Blessed Sacrament, even in its damaged condition, as an act of sharing in the suffering of Christ.

We are still praying about what to do with the pyx. But this dynamic of prayer, centered on the Eucharist, is a reminder to us that the Eucharist is indeed our common share in the eternal sacrifice of Christ. This week, more than any other time, we come face to face, heart to heart, with this mystery. Let the Lord do what he needs to do, with you, and with us all.

CHWAŁA I POKORA

Niedziela Palmowa otwiera Wielki Tydzień, tydzień o najbogatszej liturgii i najbardziej intensywny w przeżyciu. Nie jest to jedynie przeżywanie wspomnień, "czczenie pamięci". Przezywając czy wręcz uczestnicząc w wydarzeniach, które miały miejsce w Jerozolimie, powinniśmy zaczerpnąć z bogactwa zawartych w nich



lask. Wielki Tydzień to czas przeżywania wydarzeń zbawczych; to czas do pobudzenia wiary. Życie Jezusa na ziemi palestyńskiej, tak jak i życie każdego z nas - ludzi, to nieustanne przeplatanie się chwały i pokory. Święty Jan najwspanialej głosi chwałę Jezusa, a przecież jego opis Meki rozpoczyna się jakże pokornym umyciem nóg. Święty Paweł tak oto, w wielkim skrócie, nakreśla nam zarys tajemnicy Jezusa i tego, co przeżyjemy podczas Wielkiego Tygodnia: "Chrystus Jezus, istniejąc w postaci Bożej, ogolocił samego siebie, przyjąwszy postać sługi. Unizył samego siebie, stawiając się posłusznym aż do śmierci i to śmierci krzyżowej. Dlatego też Bóg Go nad wszystko wywyższył".

Przed uroczystym wjazdem do Jerozolimy Jezus przemawia niczym jasnowidz i władca: "Idźcie do wsi, znajdziecie oslice i zrebie; odwiążcie je i powiedzcie: Pan ich potrzebuje". I rzuca płomien wielkiego proroctwa: "Jerozlimo, oto Król twój przychodzi do ciebie". Oto godzina mesjaska, godzina królewska, rozbrzmiewa hosanna. Teraz już Jezus zgadza się, aby Go obwołano Mesjaszem: Meka i Zmartwychwstanie, cierpienie i chwała, objawia jakim jest Mesjaszem i jakie przynosi zbawienie.

Ale od tej królewskiej wielkości Mateusz natychmiast przechodzi do pokory: "Król twój łagodny, siedzi na osiolku". Czegoś takiego nie wymyśliłby żaden ówczesny zwyczajnik władca, ale jakież byłby nasz Chrystus z Niedzieli Palmowej, gdyby paradował na bojowym rumaku? Osiołek pozwala nam o wiele łatwiej pojąć te trudne wyobrażenia: Jezus Chrystus jest Bogiem i jest pokorny, jest królem i sługa, prowadzi nas na drogi wielkości i skromności. Kto poprzestaje na jednej tylko z tych rzeczy, źle rozpoczyna Wielki Tydzień oraz życie ucznia. Idąc za Chrystusem, nie jesteśmy nikim, ale też najmniejsze uczucie pychy może być dla nas zgubne. Nasz król jest z nami, na osiolku; nasz król jest pokorny i łagodny, i czuje się szczęśliwy, otoczony przez skromnych grzeszników, szczęśliwy wśród okrzyków maluczkich, których szczególnie sobie upodobał. Mesjasz wydaje się mówić: Ty, człowieku bogaty, nie zostajesz odrzucony, ale jeśli przybywasz dzisiaj, przynies swoje skromne serce.

Znowu wtwarzająca się historia, ewangelista odnotowuje: "Gdy wjechał do Jerozolimy, poruszyło się całe miasto, i pytano: Kto to jest? A tłumy odpowiadały: To jest prorok Jezus z Nazaretu w Galilei". W pełni triumfu zostajemy sprowadzeni do pokory Wcielenia: skromny rzemieślnik galilejski w Jerozolimie! Wkrótce zstąpimy w samą przepaść tego upokorzenia: skazanie na krzyżu, ale zaraz potem możemy wnieść się na szczyty wolając za św. Tomaszem: „Pan, mój i Bóg mój”.

MSZA ŚW. WIELKANOCNA DLA CHORYCH

W drug¹ Niedzielę Wielkanoc¹ czyli 3 kwietnia w naszej parafii będzie odprawiona uroczysta Msza św. Wielkanocna dla chorych i wszystkich tych, którzy nie mog¹ regularnie uczestniczyć w obchodach Wielkanocy. Msza św. rozpocznie się o godz. 2:00 po południu; podczas tej Mszy zostanie udzielony sakrament Namaszczenia Chorych, a na zakończenie uroczyste błogosławieństwo. Warto skorzystać z okazji i umożliwić udział w tej szczególnej Mszy św. tym wszystkim, którzy nie mają możliwości regularnie uczestniczyć w tego rodzaju celebracjach w naszym kościele. Równocześnie jest to wspaniała okazja, aby nacieszyć wzrok pięknie udekorowan¹ na Wielkanoc swiętyni¹.

Już tylko tydzień dzieli nas od najradośniejszego poranka wielkanocnego. W Niedzielę Zmartwychwstania świat chrześcijański będzie ogłasza³ po raz kolejny zwycięstwo Chrystusa. Zanim to jednak nastąpi przez najbliższe dni pozostajemy w duchu pokutnym. Jeszcze w środę i Wielki Czwartek możemy uczestniczyć w **Gorzkich Ćwiczeniach**, zaś w Wielki Piątek o godz. 7:30 wieczorem, odprawimy uroczyst¹ **Drogę Krzyżow¹ ze owiecami**, na zewnątrz kościoła. Porządkiem nabożeństw Wielkiego Tygodnia mamy podany w innym miejscu biuletynu. Warto jednak przypomnieć i zaprosić na poświęcenie pokarmów w Wielki Sobotę - od godz. 10:00 do 2:00 po południu (co godzinę), a szczególnie na **Rezurekcję** w poranek wielkanocny o godz. 6:30 rano lub na drug¹ Mszę św. w języku polskim o godz. 10:00 rano. Po tym już tylko radosne rodzinne świętowanie Zmartwychwstania Pańskiego przy uroczystym śniadaniu wielkanocnym. Na koniec bieżąca informacja dla tych, którzy nie zdążyli skorzystać z sakramentu pojednania. Ostatnie możliwości ku temu będziemy mieli najpierw dzisiaj, w Niedzielę Palmow¹, od godz. 5:00 po południu - w parafii świętych Piotra i Pawła (Garfield Hts.) oraz w środę w naszej parafii św. Stanisława od godz. 7:00 wieczorem.

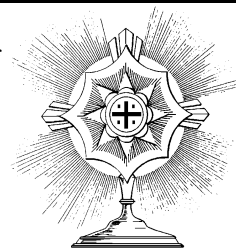
EASTER DONATIONS
