HIS HOLINESS

This past week saw an amazing outpouring of love and admiration for His Holiness, Pope John Paul II. Literally millions of people lined the streets of Rome and waited patiently for hour on end, just to have a brief glimpse of the bodily remains of one of the most amazing men in history.

Many things have been said, and will continue to be said, about him. It seems almost redundant to write a bit more in this column. What more can be added? People have been impressed with his political savvy, his warmth, his strength of character, his charisma, his leadership, his breadth of history. But perhaps all of it can be summarized in the official title given to him, "His Holiness."

What does it mean to be holy? How does one arrive at it? How does one recognize it in others? Why does it matter at all? What difference does it make to the world?

People have so many impressions or images of what the signs of holiness might be, but often these impressions dwell on the surface. The media do not help in this. We expect holy people to be somehow ethereal, as if they could float in the air. We expect them to be soft-spoken, as if having a strong voice

means something too earthy. We expect them to be above the fray, we like them on an ivory tower, as if regular folks like ourselves could not really be holy. We expect them to use words and express ideas that we cannot truly understand, as if that alone would indicate their grasp of the eternal mysteries.

But what we have seen in Pope John Paul II, more than anything, is that holiness has nothing to do with putting on its outer trappings. Instead, it has to do with a deep authenticity before God and others. As St. Francis of Assisi once said, "A man is who he is before God, and no one else." The call to holiness is at the core of every Christian vocation, whether you are the pope or not. Parents are called to be holy. Small children are, too. Poor people are called to be holy, as are the rich and everyone in between. Handicapped people are, and so are the able-bodied. Politicians, laborers, soldiers, teachers, managers, priests, the unemployed, the overworked — everyone is called to be holy.

If everyone is called to be holy, it would be unfair of God, then to make that holiness unreachable. Instead, you are called to be holy by being precisely the person God has made you to be. "His holiness," the holiness of John Paul II, will be different from "your holiness," or mine, or your friend's. By being fully and deeply who he truly was, John Paul II showed us all that holiness is possible for us as well. After all, our deepest and truest selves are exactly where we meet God, who made us in His own divine image and likeness. When we find and love in ourselves what God love sin us, then we will have truly begun the path to holiness.

Ojciec Święty JAN PAWEŁ II zmarł o 21:37 (19:37 GMT) 2 kwietnia 2005r. w swoich apartamentach w Watykanie.

Niemal każdy człowiek na świecie, a już na pewno każdy Polak chciałby w jakiś szczególny sposób zapamiętać wielkiego człowieka i największego z rodu Polaków - Ojca Świętego Jana Pawła II, o którym możemy mówić już tylko w czasie przeszłym. Już ukazało się wiele różnych Jego biografii i historii o Nim, na pewno ukaze się jeszcze więcej. Trudno silić się na jakąś oryginalność. Tym bardziej, że przecież nie o to tu chodzi. Szukając wiadomości w różnych źródłach udało mi się zebrać swoiste "ostatnie przesłanie papieskie" Ojca Świętego Jana Pawła II.

Najpierw więc ostatni telegram Polskiego Papieża: *J. Em. Ks. Kard. F. Macharski Abp Metropolita krakowski, Kraków: **Zbliża się Niedziela Miłosierdzia Paskiego. Z tej okazji pragnę przesłać moje serdeczne pozdrowienie wszystkim, którzy będą się gromadzić w krakowskim Sanktuarium w Lagiewnikach, aby wielbić Boga za Jego przebacząca miłość. Pragnę ponownie zawierzyć tej Miłości Kościół i świat, wszystkim ludzi na całym okręgu ziemi, a także siebie samego w mojej słabości. Cieszcie się, że w te niedziele rozpocznie się w sanktuarium wieczysta adoracja Najświętszego Sakramentu. Nic tak, jak Eucharystyczna obecność Pana, nie uobecnia dzieła miłosierdzia, które dokonało się przez Krzyż i Zmartwychwstanie. Niech zatem ta obecność będzie dla wszystkich pielgrzymów źródłem mocy i nadziei. Wszystkim czcicielom Bożego miłosierdzia z serca błogosławie: W imię Ojca i Syna i Ducha Świętego.***

Watykan 31 marca 2005 r. Jan Paweł II, Papież

O poniższym zaś przesłaniu można powiedzieć, że jest już „zza grobu”. W Niedzielę Miłosierdzia Bożego, 3 kwietnia, na zakończenie liturgii na Placu św. Piotra odmówiono modlitwę okresu wielkanocnego Regina Coeli. Poprzedzające ją rozważanie przygotowane jeszcze przez Jana Pawła II odczytał arcybiskup Leonardo Sandri. Papież nawiązywał do śladów meki obecnych na ciele Zmartwychwstałego Chrystusa. Ukazują one miłosierdzie Boga, który tak umiłował świat, że dał Syna swego Jednorodzonego (J, 3,16). Dalej słowa Jana Pawła II: *„**W centrum białej niedzieli zadedykowanej Bożemu Miłosierdziu znajduje się owa tajemnica miłości. Ludzkości, która niekiedy wydaje się zagubiona i zdominowana potęgą zła, egoizmu i leku zmartwychwstały Pan ofiaruje w darze swą miłość, która przebacza, jedna i na nowo otwiera dusze na nadzieję. Jest to miłość, która nawraca serca i obdarza pokojem. Świat potrzebuje dziś bardzo zrozumienia i przyjęcia Bożego Miłosierdzia „Panie, który przez Twoją śmierć i zmartwychwstanie objawiasz miłość Ojca wierzymy w Ciebie i z ufnością wypowiadamy dziś: ‘Jezu ufam Tobie, miej miłosierdzie nad nami i nad całym światem!’.**”* Zaś w nawiązaniu do obchodzonej następnego dnia uroczystości Zwiastowania Papież zachęcił wiernych do spoglądania oczyma Maryi na tajemnicę miłości miłosiernej. Z jej pomocą możemy zrozumieć prawdziwy sens wielkanocnej radości, która płynie z pewności, że Ten, którego Maryja nosiła w swym łonie, cierpiał i umarł za nas – prawdziwie zmartwychwstał. *ks. Jerzy*

The amount of dated Masses may be limited per person, so that others may have an opportunity to reserve dates also. If you have many Mass intentions, we can list them as "undated Mass intentions" to be offered by visiting priests during concelebrated Masses!

We still have a number of Weekday Masses available for some of the later months in 2005 that can be booked also.

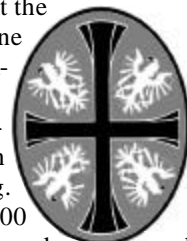
AMERICAN BOYCHOIR TO PERFORM HERE
