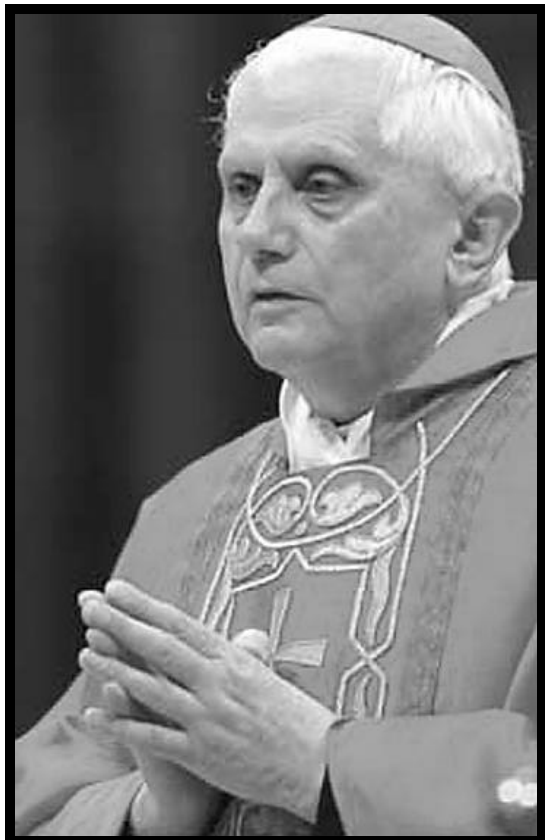

HABEMUS PAPAM!

“Where were you when you heard?” This is a question we ask when very important news breaks suddenly. Since Tuesday is my school day, I was in the eighth grade classroom when it was announced over the

school P.A.: The church bells are ringing because we have a new pope. Instantly the class discussion ceased, and all attention was turned to the TV set and the crowds gathering in Rome. Soon the seventh grade joined us, and dozens of young people caught the spirit as we waited for more news. Did you see the smoke? Who did they pick? What will his name be? Is it really raining in Rome?

It was a rare gift to share the moment with young people who had never seen such a thing in their lives. Indeed, most of us only hear those joyful, powerful words only a very few times: *Habemus Papam!* We have a pope!

As wonderful as it was with our young people, a stranger scene was unfolding in our rectory living room. As Fr. Kim and the staff sat with eyes glued to the TV, in came two TV news crews! “What are you thinking right now? How does it feel? Any thoughts about what is happening?” People in TV land were hooked, and they knew they would be welcome at St. Stan’s for a chance to share the moment, as odd as it was having strangers with cameras in our living room!

When the senior cardinal called out the name of the one who had been chosen, hearts around the world rose with glee. Yet is no secret that many hearts sank as well. Cardinal Ratzinger already been an obvious favorite, and the old saying is, “Whoever enters the conclave as a pope, leaves as a cardinal.” In other words, the one who expects to get it, won’t. Some thought he’d be the kingmaker, but not the king. Others were pleased that, as the right hand man for Pope John Paul II, this is a clear signal that we will continue the legacy that had begun 27 years ago.

Already the media are talking about what Pope Benedict XVI will do with and for the Church and the world. But this speculation, like the last, is more likely destined to be wrong. He has never been Pope before. We believe that the Holy Spirit, whose presence was invoked continuously around the world, was truly active in choosing our new Pope. God chooses human instruments and uses us in ways that can amaze even ourselves.

Perhaps what is so discouraging now is the chorus of divisiveness that we hear from some quarters. Many conservatives are gloating, and many progressives are shuddering. Critics on both sides of the divide have an attitude of, “We were right all along, and the rest of you have it all wrong.” Let’s pray that the kind of political divisions that plague our country don’t spill over into the church as well. Benedict XV was a reconciler in the early part of the last century. Maybe that is why Ratzinger chose this name as the first pope elected in this new century.

The Holy Father asks for our prayers, and this we promise him. He also promises to be a faithful servant, and this we ask of him. The Lord Jesus promises to be with us until the end of time, and this is a promise that is eternal indeed.

PAPIEZ BENEDYKT XVI

W miniony wtorek, 19 kwietnia dok³adnie o godz. 17:50 czasu europejskiego bia³y dym nad kaplic¹ Sykstyñsk¹ da³ znak, ¿e konklawe kardyna³ów wybra³o nowego papie¿a. Parê chwil po³niej potwierdzi³y tê wiadomœ watykañskie dzwony. W nastêpnych minutach Plac ¿w. Piotra oraz przyleg³e place wype³ni³y dziesi¹tki tysiêcy rzymian i pielgrzymów. Dok³adnie o godz.

18:42 z centralnego balkonu Auli B³ogos³awieñstw kard. protodia-kon Jorge Arturo Medina, Chilijczyk, wypowiedzia³ znane s³owa: *Annuntio vobis gaudium magnum: habemus papam!* Po og³oszeniu nazwiska ust¹pi³ miejsca nowemu papie¿owi **Benedyk-towi XVI** Takie papieskie imie przybra³ nowowybrany na stanowisko kard. Józef Ratzinger.

Nowy papie¿ urodzi³ siê 16 kwietnia 1927 r. w Marktl nad rzek¹ Inn w niemieckiej Bawarii. Pod koniec II wojny œwiatowej powo³any zosta³ do s³u¿by wojskowej w obronie przeciwlotniczej. Po zakoñczeniu wojny studiowa³ filozofiê i teologiê, czego zwieñczeniem by³o przyjêcie œwieceñ kap³añskich w 1951 r. Ju¿ dwa lata p³ójniej uzyska³ doktorat na podstawie pracy nad jednym z dzie³ ¿w. Augustyna. Jako niezwykle zdolny naukowiec i dobry kaplan szybko pial siê po stopniach kariery zarówno naukowej i stricte koœcielnej. Szybko awansowa³ w hierarchii niemieckiego Koœciola Katolickiego. Tuz przed wyborem polskiego kardyna³a Karola Wojty³y na Stolicê Piotrowa biskup Ratzinger zosta³ podnie-siony przez papie¿a Paw³a VI do godnoœci kardyna³a.

Jego osoba zosta³a zauwazona na forum Koœciola Powszechnego o wiele wczesniej. Ju¿ w czasie Soboru Watykañskiego II zwróci³ na siebie uwagê jako liberalny teolog (o dziwo!). Szybko jednak sta³ siê konserwatysta, by bronici wiary przed rosnacym sekularyzmem, kiedy zszokowa³y go bunty studenckie w 1968r. Przez jakis czas wyklada³ teologiê na ró¿nych uniwersytetach niemieckich. W 1977 r. papie¿ Pawe³ VI mianowa³ go arcybiskupem Monachium.

W trzy lata po swoim wyborze Jan Pawe³ II dostrzegajac nieprzecietne zdolnoœci kard. Ratzingera powierzył mu stanowisko Prefekta Kongregacji Doktryny Wiary w Watykanie, nastêpczyni Swietej Inkwizycji. Stosunkowo szybko m³ody kardyna³ ujawni³ swoje niezłomne pog³ady jako odważny obroñca czystoœci wiary katolickiej. Najpierw wystapi³ przeciwko popularnej w Ameryce Laciñskiej teologii wyzwolenia, która próbowa³a łączyç elementy ewangelii z marksizmem, i uciszył jej zwolenników. W 1986 r. og³osi³ ostre potêpienie malzenstw osób tej samej p³ci. Podczas zebrania Kolegium Kardyna³skiego w 1991r. Ratzinger nazwa³ ustawy aborcyjne pañstw zachodnich “kultura œmierci”. Zas zapewnie niedawno, bo w roku 2004 stanowczo zganil “radykalny feminizm” jako ideologiê, która podkopuje rodzinê i zamazuje naturalnà ró¿nicê miedzy mezczyzna i kobieta.

Przyjaciele Ratzingera uwa¿aja go za najlagodniejszego - prywatnie - czlowieka na ziemi. Kard. Józef Ratzinger, który przez wiele lat by³ bliskim współpracownikiem Jana Paw³a II, zosta³ wybrany jako 264 nastêpca ¿w. Piotra, w nastêpny dzieñ po wy³oszeniu homilii na otwarcie konklawe, homilii, któr¹ wielu uwa¿a za programowy dokument jego dzia³alnoœci. Przedstawi³ tam siebie jako niez³omnego obroñcê “dojrza³ej wiary”, odpornej na pr¹dy “mód i nowinek”. W osobie papie¿a Benedykta XVI skupi³y siê wszystkie cechy, jakich potrzebuje idealny straznik doktryny wiary

All are welcome! You may freely decide just how "recently" you are a registered parishioner. We look forward to meeting you!

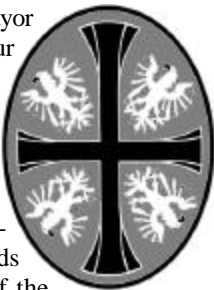
THE FOUR EAGLES BANQUET AND AWARD PRESENTATION
