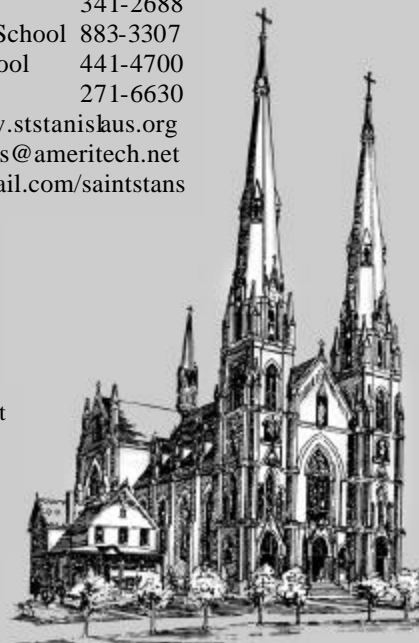

### UPDATE FROM MISSISSIPPI

This past week we received a letter from Br. Andrew Brophy, OFM. Br. Andrew coordinated the relief efforts of Hurricane Katrina for the Franciscan Mission and wrote on behalf of the Franciscan Friars in Greenwood, MS. I would like to share it with you.

Dear Mike

*...All of the evacuees that were in the Greenwood area are now in some type of more permanent housing. The Simmons family has moved from the trailer to an apartment just down the road from here. Kenneth and Birdie Gibson remain in the trailer as they wait for an apartment to become available... Following a trip to New Orleans Kenneth showed me some pictures of his house in the 9th Ward. The house was still there—just moved over a few feet from the foundation. He entered the house with Dexter, his son-in-law, and saw a huge whole in the roof. The smell was beyond description. Many of his neighbor's home were gone or destroyed...*

*Miss Betty Mae has been busy at St. Francis Center preparing relief boxes for the evacuee families. ...We also contributed many, many boxes of items to relief efforts in Biloxi and New Orleans. A Gentleman from Greenwood arranged for semi-trucks to travel to each of the locations carrying donated supplies from our area.*

*We continue to work with St. John's United Methodist Church with the purchase of furniture for the evacuees who are living in the area. (Fr.) Greg applied for and received a grant of \$25,000 from the Mid-South Foundation to assist us with the purchases. We also contributed \$10,000 from the funds sent to us (from St. Stans) for this effort.*

*We are now offering assistance to our neighbors to the south along the Mississippi coast. I was looking for a parish with a "Franciscan connection" so I contacted the Diocese of Biloxi to see what we could do for St. Clare Parish in Waveland, Mississippi. Last week I spoke with Fr. Martin Gillespie, pastor, who told me that the church, rectory, school and parish hall were destroyed. He was awaiting the installation of power poles—they had no electricity since Katrina—in hopes of opening school today. Once the electricity is connected, he plans to convert a storage shed, which somehow miraculously survived the storm, into his office. The church and school are operating out of Quonset huts. He stopped me in my tracks when he said, "We have plenty of the most important things and that is hope, the rest was destroyed."*

*...As you can imagine the stories are amazing and frightening, but somehow filled with the hope that they will overcome what has happened to them and rebuild. For them the people are more important than the buildings. (Fr.)Jim, (Fr.)Greg and I plan to load up a truck and head down to the coast the first week of November. We will be taking school supplies, books, children's toys, flashlights and batteries from the supplies sent by the good people of St. Stanislaus and Cleveland.*

*Please know that the good work you did continues to help people in desperate circumstances. I will let them know that they have good friends "up north" praying and rooting for them. Thank you again for all you did.*

### MADROSC

Ten temat jest zawsze na czasie. Liturgia dzisiejszej niedzieli wysławia madrosc. Pierwsze czytanie z Księgi Madrosci pochwała zarówno ja, jak i tych, którzy jej pragną i szukają. Madra postawe ukazuje przypowieść o dziesięciu pannach z Ewangelii. Niestety, tylko pięć z nich zasłużyło na miano roztropnych, bo odpowiedzialnych, zyjących nie tylko chwila obecna, ale myślących o przyszłości. Zs. Sw. Paweł przypomina nam prawdę o zmartwychwstaniu Chrystusa – podstawie naszej nadziei, że i my kiedyś zmartwychwstaniemy. Odsłania przed nami rzeczywistość, której ludzki rozum o własnych siłach nie jest w stanie pojąć i zaakceptować. Dlatego potrzebna jest madrosc, która od Boga pochodzi. Od Boga, który nie tylko jest Miłością, ale najwyższą Madrością, która przerasta naszą.

Wielkim skarbem jest madrosc, a szczęściem człowieka – ją posiadać. Jednak nie wszyscy o nią się troszcza. Nie wszyscy jej szukają. Choć może każdy chciałby być mądrym, to w rzeczywistości nim nie jest. Dlaczego tak się dzieje?

Pierwszym głównym i podstawowym krokiem w kierunku madrosci jest nauka. Nie wszyscy jednak wystarczająco o to się troszcza. Ten problem najlepiej widac w szkole. Dostrzegają go nauczyciele, ubolewają rodzice, gdy widzą, że ich dzieci nie chcą się uczyć. A starsi z perspektywy lat wiedzą, że tu chodzi o przyszłość. Często waga się losy, kim człowiek będzie, jak sobie ułoży życie. Nie ma innej drogi do madrosci jak zdobywanie wiedzy, poznawanie prawdy, zgłębianie jej. Trzeba się uczyć nie tylko w szkole. Mądry, to człowiek, który przez całe życie się uczy, który wciąż szuka mądrzejszych od siebie, który wie, że to, co umie, to kropla wody w oceanie wiedzy i umiejętności, która dysponuje ludzkością.

Inną przeszkodą na drodze do madrosci jest odrzucanie tego, co tradycyjne i stare, a zachłystanie się tym, co modne i nowe. Ważne jest, aby być otwartym na pewne nowości w wielu dziedzinach życia, ale trzeba pamiętać, że o wartości ludzkiego dzieła decyduje przede wszystkim czas. On sprawdza, on wydaje wyrok na wszystko, co czyni człowiek. Stąd też wartości, które przetrwały wieki są znaczącym dorobkiem ludzkości, z którego zawsze możemy korzystać. To, za czym dziś gonimy za kilka lat może okazać się puste i bezwartościowe. Madrosc nie jest niewolnikiem mody, bo ona ceni to, co sprawdził czas.

Inną przyczyną, dla której ludzie nie zabiegają o prawdziwą madrosc jest złe rozumienie wolności. Madrosc wzywa do liczenia się z Bogiem, który jest jej źródłem, a człowiek nierzadko chce być niezależny nawet od Boga, wolny od Jego praw i przykazań, które postrzega jako czynnik ograniczający swobodę jego życia. Postępuje tak nieraz w imię niezależności myśli, nauki, wolności w poszukiwaniu prawdy. Mówi że jest człowiekiem poszukującym. Ale czy Bóg, który stworzył człowieka wolnego, a gdy popadł w niewolę, na nowo go wyzwolił, chciałby go ograniczać i zniewalać? Przecież On swoją wolnością z każdym człowiekiem niejako się podzielił. Człowiek może powiedzieć Bogu „nie”. Ale dokąd taka postawa prowadzi? Szukać madrosci należy w samym jej źródle. Dlatego droga do prawdziwej madrosci, to droga do Boga. To droga modlitwy, droga rozmyślenia, rozważania słowa Bożego, głębszej refleksji nad sobą, swoim życiem, swoją przyszłością.

The month of November is traditionally set aside for the prayerful remembrance of the faithful departed. At Saint Stanislaus Church, we have a special devotion to our loved ones who have been called from this life into eternity. ## WYPOMINKI

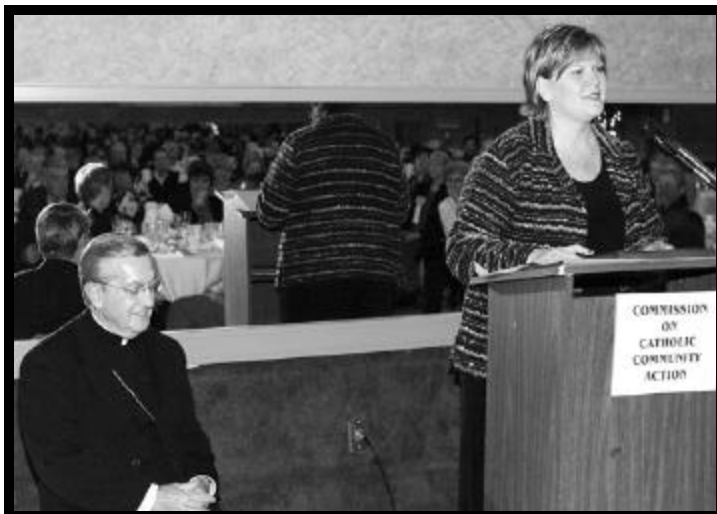
Listopadowe dni to czas szczególnej zadumy nad przemianami życia, jego sensem i wiecznością. W tym miesiącu wspominamy tych co odeszli, pamiętamy o bliskich w modlitwie. Jest pięknym, odwiecznym zwyczajem, że naszych zmarłych polecamy wspólnym modlitwom Kościoła zwanych **wypominkami**. Nie odkładajmy tej sprawy na ostaną chwilę; przez cały listopad nazwiska zmarłych będą czytane w naszym kościele przed każdą 1 Mszą św. Serdeczna prośba: **nazwiska naszych zmarłych wypisujmy wyraźnie, najlepiej drukowanymi literami, by można było bezbłędnie wpisać do Księgi Zmarłych.**

## MANNA PROGRAM

Juz od kilku miesiecy w naszej parafii funkcjonuje tak zwany **Manna Program**. Polega on na tym, że nasza parafia Sw. Stanisława współpracuje z wieloma instytucjami handlowymi typu sklepy, restauracje czy stacje paliwowe itp.. Współpraca ta jest bardzo korzystna dla parafii, ponieważ od każdego zakupu dokonanego w tych jednostkach handlowych do parafii trafia procent od wydanej sumy pieniędzy. Jednak, aby tak się stawało konieczny jest jeden warunek: przy dokonywaniu zakupu musimy posługiwać się specjalną kartą, zakupioną w naszej parafii. Taka karta możemy nabyć w każdą niedzielę po Mszy św. przy wyjściu z kościoła lub w tygodniu w kancelarii parafialnej. Czyli krótko: wystarczy czek lub gotówka przeznaczona na zakupy zamienić na kartę oferowaną w naszej parafii, a przyniesie to wymierną korzyść dla parafialnego budżetu.

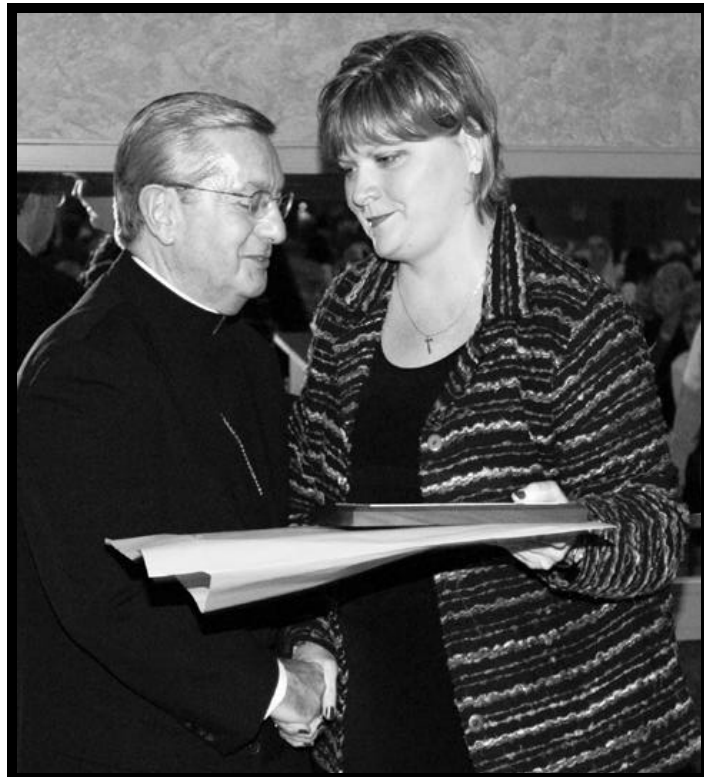
