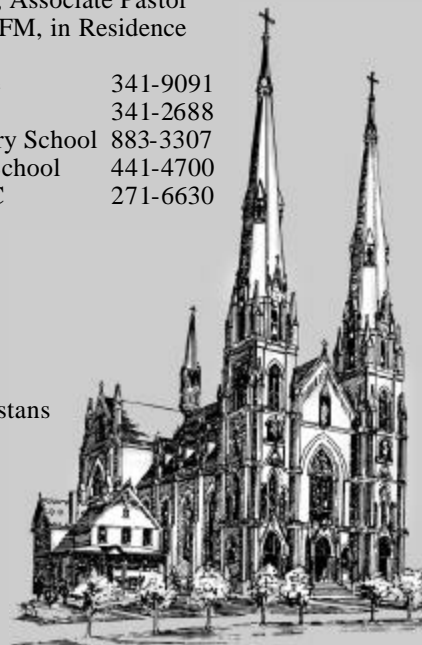

BATTLE OF THE GODS



Years ago, it was a common taunt for children to tease each other by saying, "My Dad can beat up your Dad!" This wasn't really intended to be an actual brag about our own Dads. Instead, we were trying to make ourselves seem more powerful by invoking the supposed strength of our Dads. If my Dad is stronger than yours, then by inference, I am stronger than you.

So there! Nyah nyah nyah!

Although it seems childish now, a bit of that is going on in the Old Testament. The Book of the Prophet Daniel, from which we hear at Mass this weekend, was among the last of the Old Testament writings. It appeared within the last two hundred years before Christ. During this time, there was a new style of writing called "apocalyptic." This style continued to be used through the lifetime of Jesus. Some examples of it can be found in the gospels, and traces are in the letters of St. Paul as well. But the biblical book most noted for this writing style is the Book of Revelation, also called the Apocalypse.

The apocalyptic style of writing was intended to give hope to people who felt oppressed or overwhelmed. It acknowledges that the current times are tough, but it also assures them that there is a final victory which belongs to God — and, but extension, to them as well. It may seem for a while that they are losing the battle. But the apocalyptic style places the human struggle into the context of a larger, cosmic struggle. Forces that are larger, stronger, and more eternal are locked in battle with each other. We mortals are like the grass in the jungle being trampled by combating elephants.

This is why Daniel and Revelation have such strange and frightening images. They are not meant to be taken literally, though some Christians take them to be exact predictions of a future that must be right around the corner. Instead, we who struggle with the ordinary (and sometimes extraordinary) challenges to faithful discipleship are reminded that we are not alone, that God is turlly with us and through Christ has secured the final victory that is simply working itself out in time.

The people of the early Old Testament times believed that many gods indeed existed, but that Yahweh was the best, true, most powerful God. Therefore, they spoke and wrote about their God as being the *most* powerful, the *most* high, the *most* holy. Only later on did they come to believe that no only is there one true God, but that the others didn't even exist at all. Then the language began to refer to God not just as the *most* holy, but holiness itself; not just the *most* good, but goodness itself; not as just the *most* powerful, but as power itself; etc.

Jesus revealed most clearly what the inner reality of God is actually about. In Jesus, we see precisely what goodness, holiness, and power is when it takes on human flesh. And this revelation is surprising indeed! For we see in Christ the King a style of ruling that is not oppressive or coercive. It is gentle, serving, and seeks us out by invitation and allurements. The call to follow Jesus is neither a form of slavery nor an obedience that is contrary to our nature. Rather, it is true freedom indeed to follow Jesus. It is the fulfillment of our nature, our coming into the best of what is within us. A King who would lead us there is a King to follow indeed!

Patronka salki katechacyjnej

Od kilku tygodni mam z dziećmi katecheze w naszej nowej sali w budynku „Gift Shop”. Nasza salka jest coraz miłsza i wygląda coraz lepiej. Jest to wielka zasługa p. Grazyny Hryniewicz i rodziców naszym dzieci. Moim pragnieniem jest, aby dzieci czuły się tu jak najlepiej i jak najchętniej tu przychodzili. Pragnę, aby to była **ich** salka. Dlatego postanowiłem nadać jej imię. Po zastanowieniu uznałem, że najlepsza Patronka tej salki będzie św. Teresa od Dzieciątka Jezus, zwana potocznie Mała Tereska w odróżnieniu do Teresy Wielkiej (Teresy z Avila). Dzieci już miały okazję poznać jej postać. Zobaczyły jej fotografie. Na jednej z nich Tereska ma zaledwie 3,5 roku! Wszystkie uczestniczące w religii dzieci są więc od niej starsze. Jest święta, która odkryła wielkość w byciu małym. Papież Pius XII wyraził się o niej, że to jedna z największych współczesnych świętych. Droga świętości, która ona odkrywała jest bardzo prosta, to „mała droga”, to droga dzieciectwa.

Teresa nie potrzebowała modlitewnych formułek i książeczek do nabożeństwa: "Ja sobie tak jak dzieci, które jeszcze nie umieją czytać, ja mówię po prostu dobremu Bogu to, co chcę mu powiedzieć i On mnie zawsze rozumie". Teresa miała do Boga dziecięce, bezgraniczne zaufanie.

Mała droga Teresy uświeca zwykły, powszedni dzień. Mówi, że nie należy marzyć o czymś nadzwyczajnym, ale wykonywać z miłością to co zwyczajne. Teresa napisała: "Gdy nie mogę nic odczuwać, gdy jestem całkiem oschła, niezdolna aby się modlić, praktykować cnoty, wtedy szukam małych okazji, prawdziwie nic nie znaczących czynów, by sprawdzić Jezusowi radość. Na przykład uśmiech, przyjazne słowo jeśli wolałabym raczej milczeć, albo zrobić miłą minę". Jej życie pokazuje, że świętym zostaje się nie przez niezwykle talenty lub bohaterские czyny. Świętym jest człowiek, który wszędzie i zawsze żyje w pobliżu Boga, zgodnie ze słowami Teresy: "Nie mogę uczynić się większą..., ale chcę szukać sposobu, aby dostać się do nieba na małej drodze, na drodze prawdziwie prostej, prawdziwie krótkiej, na całkiem małej nowej drodze".

Cytując Teresę, pozostać małym znaczy: "Uznać swoją małość, wszystkiego oczekiwać od dobrego Boga, nie smuć się za bardzo swoimi biedami. W końcu: nie chcę gromadzić żadnych szczególnych zasług... Zawsze pozostałam mała i nie znam żadnego innego zajęcia, jak to, by zrywać kwiaty miłości i ofiary, i ofiarowywać je dobremu Bogu dla Jego przyjemności. Pozostać małym znaczy dalej: nie przypisywać sobie cnot, które się praktykuje, jak gdyby się było zdolnym do czegokolwiek dobrego, lecz uznać, że są one skarbem, który dobry Bóg włożył w rękę swojego małego dziecka, aby się nim posłużyć gdy go potrzebuje!" To jest mała droga dzieciectwa!

Teresa wystrzegła się, aby nie wzbudzać sobą zainteresowania otoczenia. Prowadziła swoje jednostajne życie wśród innych siostr tak niepozornie, że one aż do ostatnich miesięcy, uważały ją za całkiem przeciętną osobę, może nawet bez większych duchowych potrzeb. Teresa zmarła dnia 30 września 1897 r. Miała wtedy zaledwie 24 lata. W rok po jej śmierci ukazała się utworzona z jej pism książka "Dzieje Duszy", która podbiła świat.

Przed nami już ostatni tydzień starego roku kościelnego i ostatnie dni przed Pierwszą Niedziela Adwentu. Ten ostatni tydzień przed Adwentem w naszej kulturowej tradycji jest czasem różnych spotkań i zabaw andrzejkowych. Odwołując się do naszej chrześcijańskiej tradycji pamiętajmy, że wszelkie radosne spotkania i zabawy, dla człowieka wierzącego, powinny zakończyć się najpóźniej o północy z soboty na niedzielę, tak aby 3 Grudnia w Pierwszą Niedzielę Adwentu wejść w stosownym nastroju w refleksyjny okres oczekiwania i przygotowania się na właściwe przeżycie Świąt Narodzenia Pańskiego. Maryjna modlitwa **Godzinek** spełnia wszystkie te warunki. Stąd też postaramy się chociażby raz w tym Adwencie włączyć się w tę modlitwę w naszym kościele. Pierwsze Godzinki już za tydzień - 3 Grudnia.

ADVENT VESPERS

"This is so beautiful! I look forward to this every year! If more people knew how nice it is, maybe more would come..." These are some of the comments of parishioners who make Sunday Vespers part of their Advent preparation. It's not Mass — it is Evening Prayer, celebrated around the whole Church at the end of each day. During Advent we make it especially prayerful, with peaceful and contemplative singing as well as deep faith sharing. It is one of the public celebrations when lay people are permitted, even encouraged, to preside and share reflections. We invite women and men, young and not-so-young, to lead the community in prayer. If you haven't tried it yet, give it a half hour next Sunday at 6:00 PM and see why others are finding Sunday Vespers to be such an important part of making Advent a true "preparing the way of the Lord!"

HELP FOR RETIRED RELIGIOUS SISTERS, BROTHERS, AND PRIESTS

Has there been a religious sister, brother, or priest who has made a difference in your life? As you have moved on with your life and they have moved on to retirement, have you ever wondered who took care of them as they got older? Up until very recently, Religious were not entitled to Social Security or Medicare benefits, and their wages as they were younger and working were minimal or non-existent. Even now, Religious Orders are responsible for meeting the retirement needs of their own older members. With rising costs and fewer young members working and contributing to the community, most Orders have a huge gap in meeting retirement needs, and their retirement accounts are radically underfunded. The Sisters and Friars who have served at Saint Stanislaus for 100 years are no different.

The U.S. bishops have established a special fund to assist retired religious, and it has proven to be the most popular **second collection** in the country. It will be taken on **Dec. 9 - 10** at all the Masses. Every year the people of the Diocese respond very generously. The funds collected will be distributed to the religious communities serving in our Diocese and to others across the country.

ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT

The stained glass window in the choir loft depicts a legendary event in the life of St. Stanislaus. Bishop Stanislaus is seen with the character Piotr who had come back to life in order to testify on the behalf of the Bishop in a court of law (The Miracle of Piotrowin). When the church was initially built there was a different window in that location. That window depicted the Polish King, Jan Sobieski surrounded by German and Austrian nobles after his victory over the Turks. That stained glass window was destroyed in the tornado of 1909 and replaced by the current window.

The Slavic Village Business Incubator project is designed to promote entrepreneurship and attract new business development in the Cleveland neighborhood. As part of its overall neighborhood improvement plan, Slavic Village Development actively recruits small businesses and promotes retail corridors. With this project, Slavic Village Development is seeking to foster the creation of new businesses, with a focus on the retail and service sectors.

"This project will bring many benefits to the Slavic Village community," said Marie Kittredge, Executive Director of Slavic Village Development. "It will support entrepreneurship, fill a vacant storefront in our retail district, and help establish a new business for local consumers."

As part of the award, the Business Incubator winner will receive free rent for one year and the possibility of discounted rent in the second year for a total value of \$12,000.
