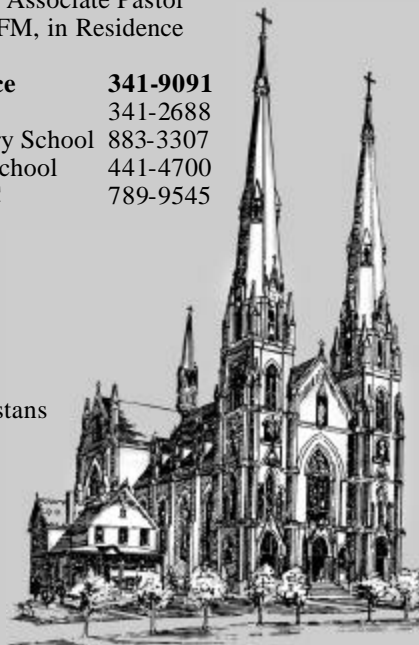

### Clevelandzka mitra i ikona sw. Stanisława i Jana Pawła II (2)

17 kwietnia 2007 r. pielgrzymi powrócili z Polski. Przywiezli ze sobą ikony do Cleveland, gdzie w Sanktuarium sw. Stanisława został przygotowany specjalny ołtarz neogotycki z myślą o beatyfikacji Slugi Bozego Jana Pawła II. Debowy ołtarz wienca symbole papieskie i biskupie oraz krzyż i cztery orły, niczym te ze Skalki. Ikona została umieszczona w ołtarzu i zarazem wprowadzona do kultu podczas uroczystych niezapórów 18 kwietnia 2007 r. Nabożenstwu przewodniczył biskup Thomas Wenski z Orlando na Florydzie. O. Michael Surufka odsłonił w czasie hejnalu jasnogórskiego piękny obraz, a następnie w procesji ikona została przeniesiona do ołtarza.

Sam pomysł ołtarza ("kapliczki") i ikony został przedstawiony kard. Stanisławowi Dziwiszowi przez o. Michaela Surufkę OFM i Dawida Krakowskiego – mistrza liturgii i muzyki z kościoła sw. Stanisława w Cleveland podczas spotkania w krakowskiej Kurii Metropolitalnej na początku listopada 2005 r. Kardynał Metropolita zaakceptował wówczas przedstawioną ideę oraz przekazał dla kościoła sw. Stanisława w Cleveland mitrę kard. Karola Wojtyły (Jana Pawła II), która tutaj została wyeksponowana i za którą wierni kościoła i Sanktuarium są kard. Stanisławowi Dziwiszowi ogromnie wdzięczni i wrecz dumni, że posiadają tak cenną relikwie związaną z Janem Pawłem II.

Do dziś z biskupia mitra kard. Karola Wojtyły związanych jest kilka cudów. M.in.: mężczyzna został uleczonej z katarakty ocznej, zaś kobieta z raka piersi. Grazyna Hryniewicz opisuje jeszcze jedno cudowne wydarzenie. Otóż jej wujek Marian Bogielski zachorował na raka prostaty. Od 14 listopada 2006 r. stan był bardzo poważny, bo doszło do zakazania krwi i lekki zawał. Chory leżał nieprzytomny i nikogo już nie poznawał. Stan był tak bardzo beznadziejny, o czym poinformował rodzinę lekarz Piotr Anders-Zalewski i bliski krewny chorego, że z Polski przyleciał syn, by pożegnać się z ojcem. Wobec zbliżającej się śmierci pacjenta sakramentu umocnienia udzielił ks. Andrzej Knapik. 21 listopada widząc stan agonizujący meza i szwagra bardzo żarliwie modliła się żona chorego i jej dwie siostry w intencji o uproszenie zdrowia i prosily o wstawiennictwo Sluge Bozego Jana Pawła II w kościele sw. Stanisława. Ponadto przywozily ze sobą koszulke chorego i polozily obok mitry. Po tej modlitwie następnego dnia pacjent odzyskal świadomość i stopniowo zdrowie. Na Święto Dziekczynienia cała rodzina mogła mówić o cudownym uzdrowieniu i dziękować Bogu. Mimo znacznego wyczerpania choroba dziś stan Mariana jest na tyle zadowalający, że może pracować w ogródku i kosić trawę.

Podczas moich rekolekcji wielkopostnych dla Polaków w parafiach sw. Stanisława, Niepokalanego Serca Maryi i sw. Jana Kantego odkryłem, że wciąż wielką jest tutaj miłość do Kościoła i do Polski. Tradycje religijne, kulturalne i obyczajowe kultywują nie tylko ci, którzy niedawno przybyli do USA, ale także ci, którzy są tutaj od kilkadziesiąt lat. Wraz z Amerykanami, których przodkowie są z różnych stron świata, dają świadectwo, że wciąż żywa jest tutaj wiara.

We are entering the graduation season. The class of 1961 from St. Stanislaus High School comprised 132 graduates. The Commencement ceremonies were held on June 4, 1961 in the new Social Center. The valedictorian was Lawrence Wojnowski, salutatorian was Therese Pawelecki. Seniors and their parents attended 9:15 AM Mass in the church that Sunday morning. The Seniors who played football had a combined 29-5 win-loss record from 1957-1960. The Panthers were champions of the North Central Conference in 1959 and 1960. The best player was Rich Badar, who went on to Indiana University and played for the Pittsburgh Steelers and Washington Redskins. In basketball the Panthers had a four year record of 53-24 and two league titles.
