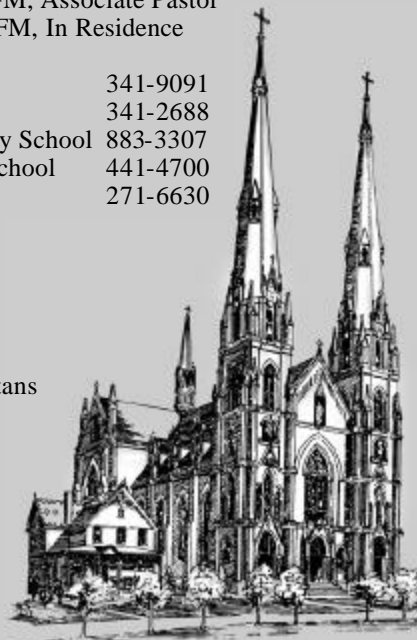

## STUFF

“Whoever has the most stuff when he dies, wins.” That was a popular bumper sticker several years ago, and of course it was meant to be sarcastic. When you die, it doesn’t matter at all how much “stuff” you have — we’re all taking the same amount with us to heaven, or, wherever.

Over the past few months at St. Stanislaus Friary, we have had one friar leave and two move in. That’s a lot of “stuff” to pack and unpack. We friars sometimes joke about the size of truck we need to pack all our poverty! Maybe that’s a good reason why we should transfer every few years. It is a good time to purge the accumulation of things that we could not possibly imagine living without.

A little over a year ago, when we moved back into the newly restored rectory, the storage company returned truckloads of “stuff” that I’d forgotten all about. I almost wished it hadn’t made it back to us! After all, we’d done fine without it for two years, not missing it a bit. Now, there are still piles of “stuff” in the attic, basement, and closets, waiting to be sorted and either stored more properly or — shudder — pitched out.

### Do you think that Mary worried about “gift-giving?”

We have a love/hate relationship with the material things in our lives. Even St. Francis of Assisi, not exactly a materialist himself, wanted to make sure the friars never gave up his favorite chapel after his death. At a certain level, there’s something very Catholic about respecting the proper role of physical things in our lives. It’s part of the Incarnation. God came to be part of this world, the world of flesh and blood, of wood and stone, of water and sunlight. Catholic worship seeks to engage our senses along with our intellects and emotions. Hence, we indulge in incense, candles, color, music, cloth, bread and wine. It keeps us rooted in the real world, the world where we all live, the world made holy by the footprints of God.

The Magi from the East brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Do you think Mary worried about re-gifting those? Gifts brought to the Giver of all gifts. Gold, for the King whose reign is not of this earth. Frankincense, which raises our prayer to the One who himself also prayed. Myrrh to anoint the baby boy, held by his mother, who would soon die with that same mother at his bloody feet.

If you’ve ever been on a pilgrimage, you’ve experienced the power of holy places and the special things within and around them. To touch the very thing that a holy person once touched or used is a deep and primal connection to that very person. This weekend, we will again have a chance to connect in a physical way with a man whose holiness is felt by all. The mitre of John Paul the Great, which we have received as a gift and a grace, seems to radiate a kind of presence. To see it, to touch it, to be blessed by it, is to encounter a reality beyond what we can sense.

This weekend, as we recall the gifts given to Jesus and Mary, may we also celebrate the gift that Jesus is to us in his Word, in the Eucharist, and in each other.

## OBJAWIENIE BOZE

Sytuacja powtarza się nieustannie: Ludzie ciągle mają problem ze znalezieniem Boga; mimo tego, że On ciągle się nam objawia.

Ponad dwa tysiące lat temu Naród, który znał zapowiedzi, który długo już czekał na Objawienie Boże, który przez wieki przygotowywał się do tego, który posiadał proroków, kapłanów i świątynie Boga żywego, ten Naród w najważniejszej chwili nie rozpoznał przychodzącego na świat Boga. Tylko nieliczni byli świadomi dokonujących się wydarzeń: Maryja, Józef, Elżbieta, kilku pasterzy. Wszyscy specjalisci od Objawienia i proroctw - kapłani, uczeni w Pismie - nie rozpoznali objawiającego się Boga.

To Objawienie przyjęli jednak poganscy Medrcy, którzy najmniej byli do tego przygotowani, a którzy na pewno nie posiadali takich wskazówek jak Żydzi. Jednak to oni lepiej niż Izraelci odczytali proroctwo o Betlejem. Dlaczego tak się stało? Byli oni bowiem bardziej otwarci na działanie Boga i Jego łaski. Możemy powiedzieć: wielka to tajemnica, ale też musimy zauważyć, że to przestroga dla nas.

Przecież dzisiaj Pan Bóg także się objawia. Dlatego należy zadać sobie pytanie, czy my, mając Pismo Święte, nauczanie Kościoła i własną życiową mądrość jesteśmy lepiej nastawieni na przyjęcie objawiającego się Boga niż ludzie w krajach misyjnych? Wygląda jakby fakty historyczne temu zaprzeczały. Przecież ateizm zrodził się w Europie - kolebce chrześcijaństwa. Gdzie, jak nie w krajach chrześcijańskich powstawały i siały dzieła zagłady wszystkie totalitaryzmy? A ostatnie lata; ktoś jak nie oświecone i tak kiedyś chrześcijańskie kraje otwierają swoje podwoje dla wszelkiego rodzaju liberalizmów i nowych amoralnych postaw? Dokąd zmierzają zarówno kraje europejskie, jak i społeczność amerykańska odrzucając, jako krepujące ludzkie swobody (do czego?), odwieczne prawo moralne wpisane w naturę człowieka?

Wygląda na to, że ta matka nauczycielka życia - historia - nie nauczyła nas niczego. Czyż nie grozi nam los Żydów? Oni chętnie się Prawem, Objawieniem, obrzezaniem, świątynią... Nasze społeczności również mają bazyliki, jesteśmy ochrzczeni, zglebiamy Pismo Święte, odkrywamy tajemnice świata, ujarzmiamy przyrodę, gloryfikujemy człowieka... ale cóż z tego skoro nie potrafimy rozpoznać Boga w kwilącym dziecku, odwracamy wzrok od samotnych, zagubionych, rozpaczonych, zmęczonych, chorych, głodnych chleba i słowa. To w nich jest Chrystus, często bezbronny, wyciągający rączkę jak w betlejemskiej stajence.

Na szczęście ciągle jednak slychac powtarzające się pytanie: „gdzie jest nowonarodzony król żydowski?” Pytanie zadają nie tylko starsi, zmęczeni, ale także wielu młodych, wielu powracających z kretych ścieżek życia, wielu zbuntowanych.

To jednak przede wszystkim nam, regularnym „zjadaczom Komunii Świętej” nie wolno zapomnieć, że najpewniejsza droga prowadząca do znalezienia objawiającego się Boga jest pokora i dobra wola, takie jakimi kierowali się medrcy i pasterze. Zawsze najpewniejsza „gwiazda” jest otwarta wiara, mimo pojawiających się czasami wątpliwości i trudności. Bóg zawsze gotowy jest nam się objawić. Wystarczy Go troszeczka poszukać.

In 1918 the Parish had 2400 families. Baptism was administered to 781 individuals, 304 mostly children received First Communion, 341 received Confirmation, and 91 couples were married. The Sunday Mass schedule was 5:30 AM, 6:30 AM, 8 AM, 9:30 AM, and 11 AM. Weekday Mass times were 5:30 AM, 7 AM, and 8 AM. Confessions were scheduled on Saturdays from 3- 10 PM. The average amount of children in the school was 2,000
