5) FR. RENE ROBERT. April 18th, police in Jacksonville, FL announced they had located a body suspected to be Fr. Rene Robert (71) in Georgia. Fr. Rene Robert began his religious life as a Franciscan Brother. He was then ordained a priest. Later, he became a diocesan priest for the diocese of St. Augustine, FL. For most of his adult life, Fr. Rene ministered to the Catholic deaf community. He taught at St. John's School for the Deaf in Milwaukee, WI, and worked in other dioceses. He took on the responsibility as the Catholic Chaplain at the Florida School for the Deaf and Blind in Jacksonville, FL, and worked there for many years. Several years ago, Fr. Rene came to Chicago and gave a wonderful week-end Mission for the deaf community in our Archdiocese. All those who attended remember his gentle, kind message, and the prayerful way he celebrated Mass in American Sign-Language.

Fr. Rene's death is a terrible blow to his family, pastoral workers with the deaf throughout the United States, and the deaf and hearing communities he served so well in Florida. When something like this happens, we have two choices. We can be angry, bitter, want revenge and punishment for the person who committed this horrible crime. However, that would not be Fr. Rene's choice. To the end, Fr. Rene Robert lived the spirit of St. Francis of Assisi in all he did. He would want us to forgive the person who killed him. The last lines of the famous prayer of St. Francis certainly remind us of who Fr. Rene Robert was, and what he certainly would want us to remember: "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. It is in pardoning that we are pardoned. It is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen." ETERNAL REST GRANT TO YOUR SERVANT, FR. RENE ROBERT, O LORD. MAY PERPETUAL LIGHT SHINE UPON HIM. AMEN.
