COLLEEN CURRY, our Office manager, works VERY hard trying to locate interpreters for wakes/funerals, but sometimes we simply cannot find any. If someone dies in your family and you need an interpreter, contact Catholic Office of the Deaf immediately. We need to know the funeral home, day and time of the wake; church and day and time of the funeral service.
