Especially during ADVENT, we should read the Bible every day. Each Sunday, the readings from the Bible are on the front page of this Church paper. If you read these, they will help you! Also, the readings from the prophet ISAIAH are especially important at this time of the year. They help us prepare for Christmas.

2 The feast of BLESSED (not yet “Saint”) CHARLES DE FOUCAULD is Dec.1. I have always admired this courageous man. In his early life he was a soldier, and a playboy sinner! Yet, when he “woke up”, he became a Catholic on 1886. He was ordained a priest in 1901, and promised to live as simple a life as possible.

He spent most of his life among Muslims in North Africa. He did not hate Muslims, and tried his best to be a sign of God’s love to them. In 1916, a young man shot Blessed Charles, stole all his clothes, and Charles died alone in the desert of Morocco. He wrote many prayers and meditations about God the Father, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and the Blessed Mother. He had a special devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist. One of my favorite prayers is from Blessed Charles:

Father, I abandon myself into Your hands; do with me whatever You will.

Whatever You may do, I thank You; I am ready for all. I accept all.

Let only Your will be done in me, and in all Your creatures. O Lord, I wish no more than this.

Into Your hands I commend my soul; I offer it to You with all the love of my heart because I love You, Lord. I so need to give myself, to surrender myself into Your hands, without limits, and with boundless confidence, for You are my Father.
