SOME NOTES FROM FR. JOE:

- 1) People ask, "How can I bring peace to the world?" PRAY the ROSARY everyday! The Rosary is a beautiful prayer. Fr. Joe has plenty of rosaries for anyone who wants one. Praying the Rosary can also give us peace. People who pray the Rosary everyday feel better physically, emotionally, and spiritually.
- 2) DRIVERS: Fall is a dangerous season. Many young people are on the streets. MORNINGS: are dark. Watch for kids going to school. AFTERNOONS: sun (west) is in our eyes. SLOW DOWN. WET LEAVES: harder for us to stop. Keep a safe distance from other cars.
- 3) MINDFULNESS: this is practice in living a more healthy life: physically, emotionally, spiritually. MINDFULNESS CLASSES: Tuesday, 10/20 and 11/10. Classes are either at: NOON-2pm or 7-9pm, Swoboda Center. Each class limited to 15 people. You must attend class on 10/20 & 11/10. Contact Catholic Office of the Deaf. FREE. Voice/Sign.
- 4) PROTECT YOUR CHILDREN/GRAND CHILDREN. Many young people "experiment" with drugs. How? They take them from YOUR medicine cabinets! If you are taking heart medications, blood pressure medicines, or any Opioid pain-relievers, LOCK THEM UP!

These services are available to attend court as a juror, defendant, witness, victim, litigant, observer for any other reason, please make your request for accommodation 14 days prior to the scheduled date. - 11) OCT.15 to DEC7: Important reminder for anyone on MEDICARE. Everyone on MEDICARE has Medicare Part "D". Part "D" is your prescription drug plan. IF you are satisfied with your present Part "D" drug plan, DO NOTHING! Your plan will automatically continue for 2016. IF, however, you are NOT satisfied or wish to switch Part "D" to another drug plan, you can do this between OCTOBER 15-DEC. 7, 2015. You must contact Medicare that you wish to switch to another plan for 2016.
