

St. Mary Catholic Church 11th Grade High School Christian Formation

Welcome. In this booklet, you will find a brief description of the Christian Formation program at St. Mary Catholic Church, class schedules, yearly Christian Formation requirements, policies and procedures and more.

Program Description

CHOSEN | The Journey toward Confirmation | (Stated in the Parent Guide)

CHOSEN will lead your teen on a journey through the Catholic Faith in all its richness and vitality. Over the course of twenty-four engaging lessons, your son or daughter will not only learn about the Faith, but will be invited to experience a personal encounter with Jesus Christ, using a combination of videos, workbook material and group discussions. The goal of the CHOSEN program is to win over the hearts of youth at this critical time in their lives and to keep them firmly planted in the faith community of the Church. The program is about learning our Catholic Faith and teaching us more about growing our love for God and becoming Disciples of Christ.

The video presentations in this program feature some of the top youth ministers in the Church today. They have been filmed on location throughout the country and internationally. A dynamic and engaging workbook is used throughout the program and contains at home pages and activities that are an essential part of the **CHOSEN** learning experience. As parents of the candidates, you play an essential role in guiding your child through this process. See Parents Guide on the next page. Also note on page 10 two additional books used in the **CHOSEN** program.

ALTARATION is also a part of the 9th Grade Program. Mass attendance is a vital part of your teen's journey to Confirmation and beyond and **ALTARATION** is an informative program about the Mass. See page 11 for more information.

Policies and Procedures

Mass Attendance | Students are required to attend Mass and participate in the Liturgy each weekend. By attending and participating as a family in the Eucharistic celebration, parents help guide their student to grow in his/her faith.

Scheduled Classes | Classes follow the 10:30am Mass on Sundays from 11:30am – 12:45pm. Students are encouraged to attend the 10:30am Mass prior to the session start time and then go directly to the school. Classes will promptly begin at 11:30am. **See pages 8 and 9 for the 9th and 10th Grade schedule.**

Materials | Teens are expected to be prepared for class, by bringing their CHOSEN Workbook, their Bible, and their willingness to listen and participate during class. Bibles are handed out in 6th grade or the first year that a student begins the High School Christian Formation Program. Teens receive their CHOSEN Workbook in the 9th Grade or as a new student to the High School program in 10th or 11th Grade. The workbook is used for all three years of the High School program. If the teen has not brought their workbook and or bible for 2 weeks in a row, they will be asked to repurchase them. The cost to replace a Workbook is \$21. Cost to replace a bible is \$30.

Classroom Behavior | It is expected that all teens will conduct themselves as God would expect them to act. It is important to work together for the common good in creating an effective learning environment. All youth have the responsibility to engage in behavior that is in the best interest of themselves, their peers and the catechist. Please remember that our catechists are volunteers. They deserve respect and cooperation. At the same time, each student deserves respect, understanding and a classroom conducive to learning. Mutual respect is expected.

Policies and Procedures continued...

Program | **Event Fees** | One half of the total program fee is due upon registration, with the balance due by February of the following year. Special event fees are due upon registration. Families with special financial circumstances or needs should contact the Director. All students will have access to our faith formation program.

Permission Slip Policy | A yearly General Permission Slip should be filled out to cover any event taking place outside of the church campus. If the event is off church property, students are required to have this general permission slip to attend. General Permission Slip forms can be downloaded from our church website at www.stmarycatholic.org.

Group | Individual Pictures and Release of Phone Numbers | Throughout the program year, photographs of the youth participating in various events may be taken. Some of these photographs may be used in the bulletin, on fliers or bulletin boards, the parish website, or other media, etc. In addition, requests may be made from St. Mary committee chairpersons or other volunteer coordinators for the names and phone numbers of teens, and families to help in many parish programs and/or events. Please be sure to fill this portion in on the registration form.

Class Cancellation | On Sundays when the weather is not safe for traveling, or if we must cancel classes for any reason, families will be informed via a ROBO call. When possible, a decision to cancel classes due to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances, will be made by 5:00pm the Saturday evening prior to classes. You must always use your best judgment. In the event that classes are not cancelled, and you feel it is not safe to attend, please call the Director of Youth Ministry to inform her that your student will not be at class. Your safety and the safety of our youth is always our primary concern.

Open Door | **Parent Policy:** Parents are invited to visit their student's class. If you wish to sit-in on a class, please let the Director and the catechist know one week prior to the beginning of the class you wish to attend.

Electronic Devices: Upon arriving on the building's grounds for any activity, whether it is regular religious education class, retreats, or other youth activities, cell phones must be out of sight during this time unless the Catechists or event leader asks that they take them out.

Service Hours: Students are required to earn **ten** (10) hours of service during each of their three years in the program for a total of **thirty** (30) hours of service by the time they are Confirmed. Service hours can be in the categories of Family, Church, and Community.

Students are required to fill out an **Individual Service Project form** (found in class-rooms, High School office and on our parish website) and turn it into the Christian Formation Office to have their hours recorded. Students are advised to turn in the form immediately after performing the service hours, as we use the form to log service hours. Forms can be turned in via mail, email or before or after class by placing them in the "in bin" found in each classroom and outside the High School Office in the school. **Without this form, service hours cannot be accurately logged.** It is always a good idea to keep a copy for your records. Please send the form to the attention of Christian Formation Assistant. See pages 12 and 13 for additional information.

Attendance or Leaving Class Early: Attendance to all classes is expected. All Religious Education classes must be attended, with serious family difficulties being the only exception. Exceptions should be discussed with the Director prior to missing class. No other activities - sports or leisure - should be viewed as more important. Youth learn their priorities from the example of adults. Please see Page 14 for guidelines on how to complete make up work. Please contact the Director via email or phone if a student requires an early dismissal to any class. Students must also bring a note stating the time they need to leave, and present it to their Catechist prior to class.

STUDENT'S WORKBOOK

Students receive their own workbook during their first year of the three year program. The CHOSEN Workbook should be brought to all Chosen classes for the three years in the program. Students are also asked to bring their Bible to each class, as well. Online programing is also available free of charge.

Additional copies of this workbook are available for \$21.






Students are usually disengaged at Mass not because they don't care about God or don't want to know Him but because no one has ever connected the dots between the ritual and the relationship. *ALTARATION* acknowledges "the elephant in the sanctuary" as Mark Hart calls it, encouraging and challenging students to take another

look – a deeper look – at the liturgy and all that heaven is doing here on earth through it.

9th Grade Students will be viewing all five modules about our Holy Mass using Ascension Press' *ALTARATION* Program. Each student will receive an *ALTARATION* Workbook to be used while in the classroom. Students are asked not to write in these workbooks. Ask them about the program and find out what they are learning about the



Mass! This Program is available for Parents (to view at home) who would also like to learn more about the Holy Mass. Please contact Sandy Schwalbe for more information.

Service Hours

- Become an Usher for one of our three weekend Masses. Please contact Sandy Schwalbe for more information and/or to be placed on the Schedule.
- Volunteer at your school as allowed.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

It's a form of prayer that began centuries ago. The word Adoration means to pay hommage to someone. The same Jesus whom we receive in the Eucharist at Mass is the same one we worship in Adoration. Adoration is a time to sit face to face with Jesus and deepen and strengthen our relationship with Him.
