The feast day of Epiphany celebrates the coming of the three kings, who came from the East, bearing gifts for the New Born Christ Child. It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk and to have families take it home to write above their doorways and pray to God to bless their home. The phrase that is written above the door is: 20+C+M+B+20. 2020 is for the year, C, M, B, has two meanings, for the 3 Magi – Casper, Melchior, & Balthasar – and for Christus Mansionem Benedicat, Latin for "May Christ Bless this House". Chalk with Home Blessing Prayers are available by the Nativity Crib.

SJ Scrip Update Total sales: \$1,145, Local sales: \$150 Thanks to all who participated! SCRIP is a gift card program in which businesses voluntarily offer a discount for cards purchased. When the cards are sold at face value, the discount stays in our parishes as earnings. For example, BP offers a 6% discount. Therefore, for every \$100 gift card sold, our parish receives \$6. Every card sold contributes to the parish earnings and it add up quickly. Since St. James began the SCRIP program it has generated nearly \$15,500!
