Lenten Meditation and Prayer:

"Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." Luke 23:34 - Jesus prays that the Father would forgive "them". Who are "they" for whom he prays? Rice Bowl and Mite Boxes Confusion sometimes arises regarding Mites Boxes and the Rice Bowl program. • The Mite Box program is an outreach of the Missionary Childhood Association, one of the Pontifical Mission Societies represented in the Mission Office. It is a mandatory annual program for elementary and middle school students in our Catholic schools and parish religious education programs. • The Rice Bowl program is sponsored by Catholic Relief Services (CRS), and the cardboard rice bowls are meant to be distributed to families in our parishes, as well as to high school students in our Catholic schools and religious education programs. It has a Lenten focus but could also be held at another time of year if desired. In any case, it is not to conflict with or replace the Mite Box program.

Lenten Regulations:

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Lent is a time to fast from certain things and to feast on others. It is a season in which we should:

- Fast from judging others; feast on the Christ dwelling in them.
- Fast from words that pollute; feast on phrases that purify.
- Fast from anger; feast on patience.
- Fast from worry; feast on Divine order.
- Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation.
- Fast from discouragement; feast on hope.
- Fast from idle gossip; feast on purposeful silence.

MASKS & SOCIAL DISTANCING REQUIRED:

In accordance with Bishop Callahan's letter to the clergy, the following must be adhered to at St. James & St. Mary: Allowing only 25% capacity of our churches while maintaining social distancing of a minimum of 6 feet between people not living in the same household. Face coverings are required in church, along with maintaining social distancing. Please remain 6 ft. apart when going to Communion, whether you are in the church or the parking lot. Please also maintain social distancing when exiting the church or in any of the gathering spaces. Be respectful of this directive as it helps protect yourself, our priest and fellow parishioners.

Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/ safeenvironment/reporting.
