Sacristans

"... 'Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the reparations for us there.' The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover." Mark 14:15:16

A sacristan, always under the general direction of the clergy, undertakes the overall preparation of liturgical celebrations, including all that is needed for daily Mass and special days such as Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday and Holy Week. The sacristan carefully arranges the liturgical books, the vestments and other things necessary in the celebration of Mass, such as cruets, chalices, ciboria, linens, oils, processional crosses and candles. They need to keep the sanctuary light burning at all times. replace used vigil candles, and change the altar cloths as needed. The sacristan in harmony with the pastor also makes sure that the vestments and liturgical vessels are kept in good condition.

He or she, should be vigilant to insure there is a sufficient supply of fresh hosts and wine as well as clean purificators, corporals, hand towels, incense and coals. The sacristan is responsible for making sure that those who wash the altar linens do so according to the indications of the missal and that the water for the first wash is poured down the sacrarium or to the earth. They also take care of burning old linens and other objects that are no longer suitable for liturgical use. In our parishes, the sacristan is also responsible for opening and closing

The Sacristan Ministry is a "behind-the-scenes" service which can be performed by individuals or couples. The entire service of this ministry occurs before and after the Mass Liturgy.

WASHING OF FEET ON HOLY THURSDAY:

Volunteers are needed to represent the 12 Apostles having their feet washed by Jesus. In Church, the foot washing ceremony is an important call for all people that they too should be willing to serve others. In the Catholic Church, this is called the Holy Thursday Mandatum, and the rite takes place after the homily. Members of the congregation are chosen to sit and have their feet washed by the priest, who plays the role of Christ. One by one, the priest will wash the participant's feet with a basin and a towel. We encourage men, women and children to please sign up. Sign-up sheets are available at both parishes.

WHAT IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF PALM SUNDAY?

(April 10th 2022): Palm Sunday marks the start of Holy Week. It's the day we celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, marking the start of what is often called Passion Week, the final seven days of Jesus' earthly ministry. Palm Sunday was the "beginning of the end" of Jesus' work on earth.

Jesus was on His way to Jerusalem with His disciples to celebrate Passover. He sent two of the disciples to retrieve a donkey colt for Him to ride, laying their cloaks over it for Him to sit on it. As He rode into the city, people spread their cloaks, palm branches in the road, while waving palm branches, proclaiming, Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. The onlookers lay their garments down in front of Him, and wave palm branches is a demonstration of victory.

The triumphal entry was predicted in Zechariah, (9:9) "Exult greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout for joy, O daughter Jerusalem! Behold: your king is coming to you, a just savior is he, Humble, and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

Palm Sunday opens Holy Week. The priest blesses palms and distributes them to the congregation recalling Christ's entry into Jerusalem. The prime attention is given to a lengthy reading of the Passion. The palms are taken home by the members of the congregation to serve as sacramentals (sacred signs of the sacraments) and kept as a reminder of Christ's victory throughout the year, or are burned & used as the ashes for the next year's Ash Wednesday service.

DO YOU KNOW WHAT A RECONCILIATION SERVICE IS? (April 4th 6:00 pm @ St. James)

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful & just and will forgive us our sins & purify us from all unrighteousness. (John 1:9)

Communal Penance Service or Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent to celebrate the reconciling love and the healing graces our Lord offers us. Reconciliation Service are a form of sacramental confession. It mixes public prayer and individual confession to a priest, followed by absolution. A Reconciliation service always includes: *The penitents and sorrow for sin, usually expressed in an Act of Contrition

*Confession of sins to a priest with absolution given *An act of penance

Usually, a reconciliation service includes a Scripture reading and brief exhortation by the priest. This is followed by and examination of conscience, and then the entire community prays the Act of Contrition together. Those present will individually confess their sins to the priest and receive absolution and a penance. The Act of Contrition is not repeated privately, because it has been part of the service. The words of absolution are said by the priest individually over the penitent or a collective penance is given. God sees everything about us, the good, bad, indifferent & he loves us completely, ready to forgive us unreservedly.

DO YOU KNOW THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS?

13th – <u>Jesus Is Taken Down From The Cross</u>

Jesus, how brutally you were put to death. How gently you are taken from the cross. Your suffering and pain are ended, and you are put in the lap of our mother. The dirt and blood are wiped away. You are treated with love.

14th – <u>Jesus Is Laid In The Tomb</u>

Jesus, your body is prepared for burial, Joseph gave you his own tomb. He laid our body there and rolled a large stone in front of it, then went home. What a sad day it has been for so many people.

The Stations of the Cross depict 14 events in the Passion of Jesus Christ, beginning with Jesus being condemned to death and ending with His body being laid in a tomb.

MARRIAGE:

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

BAPTISM:

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK:

If you or a loved one is in need of the Anointing Sacrament especially before a hospital stay or procedure - please contact the office.
