Why Do We Say this at Mass? "GLORIA" & "COLLECT"

The tone of the liturgy now shifts from sorrowful repentance to joyful praise as we arrive at a prayer known as the *Gloria*. The opening line is taken from the words sung by the angels over the fields of Bethlehem, announcing to the shepherds the good news of Christ's birth: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased." (Lk 2:14) We prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus by repeating the same words of praise that the angels used to herald Christ's coming.


We address him as "Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty *Father*." We do not stop with a mere mention of God's power and kingship. We go on to praise him ultimately as our heavenly *Father*, for not what he does for us, but for who he is, for his goodness and love.

The *Gloria*, in a sense, tells a story of Christ saving work moving from 1) his coming, to 2) his redeeming death, to 3) his triumphant resurrection and ascension into heaven.

In the *Gloria*, we joyfully express our gratitude for having received salvation from Christ. In this sense, the *Lord*, *Have Mercy* (*Kyrie*) allows us to enter the mystery of Advent as we express our longing for a savior, while the *Gloria* expresses the joy of Christmas, as we thank God for sending us his Son to redeem us.

Most remarkable is the line "You alone are the Lord." This line from the *Gloria* today challenges us to be loyal to Jesus Christ and his commandments above anything else in this world, whether it be a job, possessions, financial security, prestige, or family. "You alone are the Lord."

After the *Gloria*, the priest invites the people to pray a prayer known as the *Collect*. This prayer gathers together the intentions of the people participating in the Mass and concludes the <u>Introductory Rites</u> which you have been reading these past few weeks: 1. The Sign of the Cross - 2. Greeting: "The Lord be with you" - 3. The Confiteor (I Confess) - 4. Lord Have Mercy - 5. The Gloria and Collect.

THE PASSION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTISTS ON AUGUST, 29TH:

The feast refers to the "passion" of John's martyrdom. His love for God and hunger for Israel to return to righteousness drove him to live an ascetic life in the desert, preaching repentance and baptizing people to prepare them for the coming of the Messiah. John only wanted to point the way to Jesus.

John the Baptist was born through the intercession of God to Zachariah and Elizabeth, who was otherwise too old to bear children. The Angel Gabriel visited them to tell they would have a son and to name him John. Zachariah was skeptical and for this he was rendered mute until the time his son was born.

When Elizabeth was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leaped in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was to be the Son of God.

John began public ministry around 30 AD. When Jesus came to him to be baptized, John recognized him and said, "It is I who need baptism from you." Jesus told John to baptize Him, which he did, and the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God was seen like a dove. The voice of God spoke, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

Following the baptism of Christ, John's popularity grew so much that he alarmed King Herod, Herod ordered him arrested and imprisoned. John spoke with Herod on several occasions and condemned his marriage to his half-brother's wife.

King Herod promised to grant a wish to his daughter. She asked for the head of John the Baptist's on a platter in revenge for condemnation of her mother's scandalous marriage to Herod. King Herod reluctantly obliged. John the Baptist was beheaded sometime between 33 and 36 AD.

John's passion for the truth, for loving and serving God, was like a magnet drawing others to God. Jesus is attractive enough to melt, and ignite every human heart. Let him fill you with his love so that your love will overflow to all those around you, like John the Baptist.
