# MUSICIANS 7<sup>th</sup> in a Series

What you are is God's gift to you...
What you become is your gift to God!

"Speak to one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord."

Ephesians 5:19

The music at Mass is very important! It is not simply a performance by a soloist or choir, a background to accompany our prayer, a means to create a mood, or an incentive to shout and clap our hands.

## Music is Integral to our Liturgical Worship

Liturgical music today allows the congregation and community to participate actively in the liturgy, relating to both the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist; these are the two main parts to the Catholic liturgy. The preparation and leadership of music within the Mass greatly assists the People of God, the community as the Body of Christ, to experience "new life in the Spirit, involvement in the mission of the Church, and service to her unity". (CCC1072)

Pope Francis has clearly defined the purpose of music at Mass. He said that it is "first of all a matter of participating intensely in the mystery of God, in the 'theophany' that takes place in every Eucharistic celebration, in which the Lord makes himself present among his people, who are called truly to participate in the salvation realized by the crucified and risen Christ". Lifting our hearts to God in liturgy always goes beyond the boundaries of human speech. Thus, liturgy, by its very nature, calls upon the help of music and song to praise God.


Music plays such an important role in our worship of God because we are both body and soul. Prayer rises from the depths of our heart. Words alone do not express all that we wish to say. Music has the power to communicate the messages and emotions that words cannot capture. Music takes us out of ourselves and opens us up to God. Sound liturgical music, therefore, never centers on the community. Liturgy is not about what we want. Liturgy is, first and foremost, praise and worship of God and our entering into what the Lord himself wants for us.

## BUT HOW DO WE KNOW THE RESURRECTION DID HAPPEN?

From the accounts of those who were too scared to stand with Jesus at His final hour. After death. Christians underwent a tremendous amount of persecution, being hunted, tortured, and crucified. So naturally, those who were closest to Jesus went into hiding. They denied Him for fear of death and suffering. But after Christ's resurrection and apparition to many, something changed. How is that so? They had been with Him for 3 long years, hearing Him teach, watching Him perform miracles. Why was this different? Because it was the ultimate victory: Jesus showed us that death is not the end. We have been shown that though our bodies may die, we can look forward to "the resurrection of the body and life everlasting", as professed in our creed. Every Sunday, when we gather before God in His house, we witness Jesus's sacrifice and celebrate His conquest over sin and death. The whole liturgical calendar bows to Christ and His resurrection. You believe in me, Thomas, because you have see me, says the Lord; blessed are those who have not seen me, but still believe! (Jn 20:29) Do you believe?



## MAY IS DEVOTED TO OUR **BLESSED MOTHER?**

The entire month of May became devoted to the veneration of the Virgin Mary. The high point has always been the ritual known as "The Crowning of Mary," said to have been instituted by St Philip Neri in the 16<sup>th</sup> century. May is called Queen because she is the perfect follower of Christ, who is the absolute crown of creation. She is the Mother of the Son of God, who is the messianic King. She won the "crown of righteousness "( 2Tim4:8), "the crown of life," (Rev 2:10) "the crown of glory," (1 Pet 5:4). The flowers in her crown are said

to represent Mary's virtues, and the ritual is held in spring because she brought life into the world. Mary is the masterwork of God & the start of God bringing mankind into communion with Jesus. In Mary's womb, Jesus is the manifestation of God's wonders, the fulfillment of God's plan of loving goodness.

#### **MARRIAGE:**

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

#### **BAPTISM:**

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.

If you or a loved one is in need of the Anointing Sacrament especially before a hospital stay or procedure - please contact the office.
