
Why Do We Say this at Mass? "LITURGY OF THE WORD" THE CREED

On Sundays, Holy Days of Obligation, and Solemnities, we stand after the Homily and make the Profession of Faith, also known as the "Creed" because the first word is "Credo" which means "I believe" in Latin. Typically, we recite the Nicene Creed which capsulizes the dogmatic formulations of the Council of Nicaea.

The Creed summarizes the story of Scripture. Moving from creation to Christ's incarnation, death and resurrection, to the sending of the Holy Spirit, to the era of the Church and finally to the Second Coming. The Creed carries us through the entire story of salvation history, from Genesis to the book of Revelation: creation, fall, redemption.

So the Creed will not let us be lukewarm bystanders in this cosmic struggle. It challenges us to pick what side of the conflict we will fight for. Will we follow the prince of this world who wants us to think there is no right or wrong? Or will we follow the King of heaven and earth who leads us to happiness in his everlasting kingdom? When we profess our faith at Mass in the Creed, we publicly stand before the whole congregation and Almighty God and plant the flag with Jesus. We solemnly declare that we will strive not to live like the rest of the world, but to give our wholehearted allegiance to the Lord: "I BELIEVE IN ONE GOD ... "

If you are ever confused about what you believe as a Catholic, or if anyone ever asks you what you believe, you can simply recite the Nicene Creed for them.

"DID YOU KNOW"

from the Sacred Worship Committee

St. John Paul II, feast day is Oct. 22: God chose him for the Chair of Peter and granted him long life in order that he might accompany the Church into the third millennium. He has guided us all in this pilgrimage and continues to do so from above.

His *beautification* was the Feast of Divine Mercy, May 1, 2011. Blessed Pope John Paul II had a deep devotion to Sr. Faustina Kowalska and to the Divine Mercy devotion. In Aug. 2002, John Paul II entrusted the entire world "to Divine Mercy, to the unlimited trust in God the Merciful."

The process of *canonization* in the Catholic Church requires two miracles. According to the church, John Paul performed his first miracle in 2006 on a French nun with Parkinson's disease. It was reported that she was completely cured of the disease after members of her community prayed for the intercession of Pope John Paul II.

The second miracle occurred in 2011. A Costa Rican woman, who suffered from a terminal brain aneurism, was healed with no known natural (medical) cause, on the date of John Paul's beatification.

Pope Francis confirmed his approval of the canonization of John Paul II on July 4, 2013, in St. Peter's Square at the Vatican in Rome. The Canonization Mass was celebrated by Pope Francis and Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI.

Interesting facts about John Paul II

- 1. He was one of the most traveled world leaders in history
- 2. The first ever Pope to visit a mosque
- 3. The Pope featured in a comic book
- 4. The Pope was a playwright and actor
- 5. He out-canonized and out-beatified all popes before him combined
- 6. If you put together everything he wrote, it would equal the length of 20 Bibles.
- 7. He received the sacrament of Reconciliation from Padre Pio
- 8. He knew all 2,000+ bishops of the world by name
- 9. He forgave the man who shot him in the assassination attempt
- 10. What was the "happiest day of his life?" was the day that he canonized Sr. Faustina as the first saint of the new millennium.
- 11. His *final words* in Polish were: **"Let me go to the house** of the Father."

MARRIAGE:

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

BAPTISM:

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.
