Lent 47 days?

"These forty days of Lent, O Lord with you we fast and pray" goes the hymn. Lent started February 22. Easter falls on April 9. How do we get forty days? Isn't it more like... forty-seven? It might seem that way, but try counting it with this in mind, every Sunday is already a "Little Easter" over sin and death. So, when you take the Sundays out of the reckoning and add the Paschal Triduum, you get the Church's iconic forty days. Every Sunday, even in Lent, is a "Little Easter." We gather on Sundays because it is the Lord's day of resurrection. Sundays are never days of penance. They are always days of celebration of Christ's victory over sin and death.

St. James: First Friday of the month after morning Mass; First Thursday of the Month 4:30-5:30PM

After weekday Masses at respective Church. Saturday at 3:30 PM at St. Mary of Mt. Carmel Sunday after 10:30 AM Mass at St. Mary.

What is the proper way to receive Holy Communion?

There are two ways we can receive communion, either on the tongue or in the hand. The minister holds up the Host and says, "The Body of Christ," and we the communicant answers, "Amen," and it means, "So be it." "I agree." "I believe." "It is the Body of Christ." This is what the "Amen" means: "I honestly believe that when I receive, It Is Christ. And so I say Amen."

As a sign of piety, it's proper to make a gesture of reverence as you approach receiving the Eucharist, by genuflecting or bow.

If you are going to receive on the tongue while standing or kneeling, you should keep certain things in mind. First, come straight forward, face the minister, and don't be too far away, because it's difficult at times to reach. The head should be bent back slightly. The tongue should come out over the bottom teeth, equal with the bottom lip, so that the minister has someplace to put the Host. If you're going to kneel for Communion, remember to rise straight up, thinking about the people behind you.

If you're going to receive on the hand, the best way is to put the dominant hand down and put the other hand on top of it to make a throne for the Lord. When the minister puts the Host on your hand, you say, "Amen." At that moment consume the Host IMMEDIATELY. If you do not, you will be approached and directed to consume the Host or return the Host to the minister.

After you have received the Eucharist, you don't need to move aside and pause before the tabernacle because the Lord is within you, you are the tabernacle.


If the Host should accidentally fall on the floor, indicate it to the minister, don't pick it up, only the priest, deacon or extraordinary minister can do that.

Upon receiving the Eucharist reflect on, "It is the Lord" which is what our faith demands. It is the Lord that we are worshiping. It is the Lord that we received into ourselves. It is the Lord who is giving us in the Eucharist a special way to participate in divine life. It is the Lord who is sanctifying us. That should be the overwhelming disposition with which we approach Holy Communion: IT IS THE LORD!

What are the guidelines to receive Holy Communion?

The Catholic Church sets out specific guidelines regarding how we should prepare ourselves to receive the Lord's body and blood in Communion. First, you must be in a state of grace. "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup" (1 Cor. 11:27–28). This is an absolute requirement that can never be dispensed. To receive the Eucharist without sanctifying grace in your soul profanes the Eucharist in the most grievous manner. That is why it is so important to go to confession before receiving communion with a mortal sin on your soul.

A mortal sin is any sin whose matter is grave and which has been committed willfully and with knowledge of its seriousness. Grave matter includes, but is not limited to, murder, receiving or participating in an abortion, homosexual acts, having sexual intercourse outside of marriage or in an invalid marriage, and deliberately engaging in impure thoughts (Matt. 5:28–29). Scripture contains lists of mortal sins (for example, 1 Cor. 6:9–10 and Gal. 5:19–21). For further information on what constitutes a mortal sin, see the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

The Annunciation of the Lord is on March 25

The Annunciation of the Lord refers to the time when the angel Gabriel visited the Blessed Virgin Mary to tell her that she would be the mother of the savior. Mary was the first to hear and believe that God would do what he promised the world. Mary at her Annunciation models faith for us. She shows us that faith is more than assent, but is also trust, commitment, obedience, and submission.

MARRIAGE:

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

BAPTISM:

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.
