

Advent A Time of Preparation

This year, the season of Advent begins on Sunday, December 3rd. Advent is the four weeks we set aside for preparing our hearts before the annual celebrations of Christ's birth on Christmas. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish.
