DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY:



Everyone is welcome to Sacred Heart Parish on **Sunday**, **April 7th** as we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday! In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast

as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30th, 2000. Adoration will be from 9:00am – 3:00pm. At 3:00pm they will have Divine Mercy hours / chaplet, and procession of the Blessed Sacrament with Benediction. Confession will be held from 12:30 pm until 3:00 pm. Father Todd Mlsna will give a presentation at 2:00 pm and the day will end with a Mass at 4:00 pm.

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord

normally falls on March 25, but since that date falls on the Monday of Holy Week this year, this feast is transferred to Monday, April 8. It is not a holy day of obligation to attend Mass. The Annunciation celebrates the coming of the Archangel Gabriel to Virgin Mary and announcing to her that she is to be the mother of the Savior. The Church acknowledges the coming of the Savior with hope and joy.



2023 Diocese of La Crosse Annual Appeal

St James is at 70% of target: \$17,644 pledged against a target of \$25,285 with 41 families contributing.


St Mary is at 56% of target: \$17,510 pledged against a target of \$31,475 with 46 families contributing.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, April 7:

It is a significant time for reflection on our faith. As Pope John Paul II stated, "It is a time where we are blessed with divine mercy as it reaches us through the heart of Christ crucified." Divine Mercy Sunday focus is on the gifts that flowed from Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, his mercy and love that were so freely given to humanity after such a betrayal. People from all walks of life can humble themselves before God, and ask for his mercy, love, and forgiveness, which he grants to all those who are willing to ask for it. It is also about forgiveness and mercy, how Jesus offered his to us, and how we should act in kindness throughout our lives. Are you ready to humble yourself and ask for God's mercy?

<u>DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY - IS HERE 4-7!</u> THE ABC'S OF MERCY

Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly.

Be Merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others,

Completely trust in Jesus, God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. God expects us to let His mercy flow through us to others. His words to Saint Faustina are unmistakably clear: "I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere" (Diary, 742) WHAT IS THE MEANING TO THE SACRED RAYS ON THE IMAGE OF DIVINE MERCY?

St. Faustina received this explanation from the Lord: The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stand for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the cross...Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him (Diary 299).

The little prayer that Jesus wants associated with His image of the Divine Mercy is:

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a font of mercy for us,

I TRUST IN YOU! (Diary 187)

As you leave church each Sunday, gaze at the beautiful image of the Divine Mercy Picture, and silently say: "JESUS I TRUST IN YOU" and feel His love pour out upon you.

MARRIAGE:

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

BAPTISM:

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.
