THE RESURRECTION MYSTERY

"O truly blessed Night," sings the Exsultet of the Easter Vigil, "which alone deserved to know the time and the hour when Christ rose from the realm of the dead!" But no one was an eyewitness to Christ's Resurrection and no evangelist describes it. No one can say how it came about physically. Still less was its innermost essence, his passing over to another life, perceptible to the senses. Although the Resurrection was an historical event that could be verified by the sign of the empty tomb and by the reality of the apostles' encounters with the risen Christ, still it remains at the very heart of the mystery of faith as something that transcends and surpasses history.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In every Holy Mass we repeat: "Deliver us, Lord, from every evil, graciously grant us peace in our days, that by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ".

2023 Diocese of La Crosse Annual Appeal

Update as of 3/25/2024:


The Diocesan Annual Appeal (DAA) is extremely critical to the needy in our Diocese and beyond. Many of you have generously made a contribution and your contributions are greatly appreciated.

St James is at 64% of target: \$16,209 pledged against a target of \$25,285 with 36 families contributing. St Mary is at 52% of target: \$16,390 pledged against a target of \$31,475 with 46 families contributing. Both parishes have previously met and exceeded target for the DAA for the past <u>6 years – thank you</u>!

Your parish needs your financial support for the 2023-2024 DAA. Remember, any shortfall to the DAA target must still be paid to the Diocese. Any shortfall gets paid out of our general funds, which we need to support our day-to-day operations.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA...

Begins on Good Friday. Pamphlets with the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Intentions for each day of the Novena are at the entryways of Church.

THE PASCAL CANDLE:

The new Paschal candle towers over the Easter assembly, a majestic symbol of the joy and glory radiated by the risen Lord. Its stature is both inspiring and pragmatic, for it will burn at every Easter season Mass and every funeral rite during the year. This pillar of Christ is lowered into the baptismal font three times at the Easter Vigil in a symbolic relationship that gives birth to the baptized so they may "rise to the life of newborn children through water and the Holy Spirit."

There are so many people to thank for giving of their time and talent or for participating in many ways, to help make Holy Week a truly wonderful and Holy Week. Holy Week, and especially the Triduum, is the most solemn time in the Liturgical Church year. The three days of the Triduum is a period of time that traces the final days of Jesus' life, his death, and his resurrection from the dead, through which comes our Salvation. Today as you celebrate the Risen Christ on this glorious Easter day, say a prayer of thanksgiving for those who helped to make this week truly special. "DID YOU KNOW"

from the Sacred Worship Committee

Before the Council of Nicaea in AD 325, the date for Easter was based directly on the Jewish Passover, though there were variations among Christian communities. Passover was documented to begin the fourteenth day of the Jewish month of Nisan (our March or April) because that was when the sacrificial lambs had been slain in Egypt (Exodus 12:6, Lev 23:5, Num 9:5). The Jewish calendar is based on lunar cycles, with a month beginning with the new moon. Therefore, the fourteenth day of the month is the day or night on which there is a full moon.

There was a desire in the Christian world of AD 325 to be able to better predict when Easter would be. Because some Christians and all Jews continued to use the lunar calendar and some used the solar (Julian) calendar – which is more similar to ours – the council created the formula which is still used today, primarily as a compromise between the two but also keeping possible proximity to Passover. Easter is the *first Sunday following the first full moon following the spring equinox* and can fall between March 22 and April 25.

MARRIAGE:

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

BAPTISM:

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK:

If you or a loved one is in need of the Anointing Sacrament especially before a hospital stay or procedure - please contact the office.
