From listening to the word of God, faith is born or strengthened. So says Pope Benedict XVI in his reflection on the Eucharist as the Source and



Summit of the Church's Life and Mission. In Romans 10:17 Paul tells us, "So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes by the teaching of Christ". This portion of the Mass referred to as the Liturgy of the Word, contains readings from the Old and New Testament, culminating in the New Testament Gospel according to Matthew, Mark, Luke or John. Correlating the Liturgy of the Word with biblical references is straightforward. These readings from Divine Scripture provide us with exhortations for moral living and reflections about spiritual life. Each book of the bible is written by a human author with their own writing style, personality, theological point of view and pastoral concerns.

In these inspired books, God breathed forth his divine words through the human words of the authors. In that way, Scripture is like Jesus, fully human and fully divine. In the Mass, we prepare for the serious matter of the readings and Gospel by making the sign of the cross, confessing our sins, and praising God in the Gloria prayer. Vatican II tells us, "In the sacred books the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children, and talks with them." The lector, deacon and priest are privileged to be the instruments selected to read the Word of God, and we are blessed to hear it!

The Sunday readings are determined by a three year cycle and the weekday readings are determined by a two year cycle. Within the authority of the Catholic Church, the Apostolic See selects these readings, which allows for more complete coverage of the Word of God, versus depending upon preferences from a particular pastor or congregation.

MARRIAGE:

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

BAPTISM:

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.
