20+C+M+B+26

The feast day of Epiphany celebrates the coming of the Three Kings, who came from the East, bearing gifts for the New Born Christ Child. It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk and to have families take it home to write symbols above doorways, inviting Christ's blessing and protection for the home and its occupants throughout the year.

The inscription usually looks like **20+C+M+B+26**, representing the year (2026), crosses (holy protection), and the letters C, M, B for Christus Mansionem Benedicat (Latin for "May Christ bless this house") or the Magi (Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar).

Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ.

Chalk with the Home Blessing Prayers are available by the Nativity Scene and at the entryways. Pick up a packet to continue this Blessing tradition in your home.

Did you Know?

From Our Sacred Worship Committee

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, aka Three Kings Day.



Epiphany 2026 is a time to celebrate Christ's revelation to the world. This feast invites all to reflect on the light of Christ shining in their lives. The word epiphany is based on the Greek word meaning "manifestation" or "revelation".

Since the beginning of the liturgical year in 1969, Catholics in the United States have celebrated this feast day on the first Sunday following Jan 1st. It generally lasts for seven days.

Traditionally, the following events from Jesus' life are connected to this feast: the visit of the three Magi, the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan and Jesus' first miracle at Cana. During each of these events, we are presented with divine revelation.

The Feast of the Epiphany was instituted in the fourth-century to underscore the universal nature of Christ's mission. We are celebrating God's vision of salvation for all of us in this world, through the gift of his son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

The Epiphany of the Lord calls Christians to reflect on the gifts given to Jesus.

- * **Gold** symbolizes royalty.
- * **Frankincense** is used in the worship of God, symbolizing his divinity.
- * **Myrrh** is a burial ointment pointing to our redemption in Jesus' Passion and death.

There are no small details in the Gospels, everything means something.

As Mary pondered many things, let us ponder the words of scripture with reverence and humility. Take time to read and reread these words inspired by the Holy Spirit.

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at (715) 824-3455.
