As the painters began, they mentioned plaster would just fall from the walls. Fortunately this did not happen while parishioners were sitting in the pews.



This Advent, Jesus wants you to know the joy of saying yes. He is ready to remove every barrier in your heart.. big or small, that keeps you from living a deeper yes and receiving his life more fully.

And so he invites you to come to him in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

As you prepare to celebrate the sacrament, ask yourself a few questions, like: Is Jesus the Lord of my time, money, and other resources? Is there anything that needs cleaning up, like foul language, gossip, complaining, verbal abuse? Am I harboring anger, resentment, or hatred toward someone? Did You Know?

From our Sacred Worship Committee

On December 8th, we celebrate the feast day of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is not to be confused with the celebration of Jesus' virginal conception on March 25th with the Solemnity of the Annunciation.

The gospel from Luke tells us of the truth of Mary's immaculate conception. As the angel Gabriel approaches Mary, he proclaims, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." He sees that this flesh and blood woman is simultaneously grace-filled from the beginning of her existence. The term "full of grace" in Greek comes from the word xarito'o which tells us of a preexisting, grace-filled status. This is important as we understand through this form of the verb that Mary is grace-filled prior to her encounter with Gabriel and not made holy as she conceives Jesus. Her status is established by God, not Mary. The Lord comes to dwell not only with her, but within her. However, her assent "May it be done to me according to your word" is purely from her own will.

St. Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception ex cathedra in 1854 proclaiming that from the first moment of her (Mary's) conception,..... she was preserved immune from all stain of original sin. (see CCC 491)

Though not what this feast day is about, we Catholics believe that, among other things, Mary was "ever-virgin". In the gospel of Luke for this holy day, the angel makes nine statements to Mary. The one question Mary asks of the angel Gabriel is "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?". Note that the angel does not tell her when she will conceive, though we know that it is in the future. This question from Mary makes sense only if she never intends to "know a man" even in marriage. She has made a vow to God to be a virgin all her life and is questioning why God would ask her to break this vow. This vow is a type of abstinence reviewed in Numbers 3: 14-15, with the assertion that the husband, in this case Joseph, accepts this establishment of her vows. Mary's concern with breaking this vow is relieved when she is told by the angel that the Holy Spirit will come upon her to accomplish this conception. With thorough study of Greek grammar and cultural context, scripture scholars have provided us with great understanding of the teachings of scripture.

The Advent Wreath



Many Christian households celebrate Advent with daily prayers around an Advent wreath. The Advent wreath is a circular garland of evergreen branches arranged with four candles (and often a fifth, called the Christ candle, in the center). The circular wreath reminds us that God has no beginning and no end. The lighting of the Advent candles represents the promise of the coming of Jesus, the light of the world. The four candles are lit, one each week during Advent beginning on the first Sunday of Advent. Three of the candles are purple – royal colors to remind us that we are watching and preparing for our Lord and King. The fourth candle is rose or pink, expressing the joy on the Third Sunday in Advent, Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete comes from the Latin word for "rejoice". It is a day of joy and celebration because the midpoint of Advent has passed and the birth of Jesus is near. When there is a fifth white candle in the center, it represents Christ and is lit on Christmas Eve.

Lighting of the Advent Wreath. As we begin each Mass during Advent, parishioners will be invited to process up with Father and the servers and light the Advent Wreath candle. This is a beautiful tradition in our parishes. A special **Thank You** to the families who are participating in the lighting of the Advent wreath.

Advent Material. Please check out the Advent material at the entryways to help you prepare your heart for the coming of the Christ child. This year we have the Little Blue Book for Advent and Christmas. Be sure to take a copy for yourself! We encourage you to visit the Sacred Worship Advent Tree or Candy Cane Basket where you will find a spiritual exercise attached to each ornament or candy cane. Take an ornament or candy cane each week during Advent to help you in your faith journey.

May you have a Blessed Advent Season!
