# Facts about St. James the Greater Feast Day July 25<sup>th</sup>

- 1. Fisherman turned Apostles
  - James, the son of Zebedee & brother of John, left his fishing nets to follow Jesus.
- 2. "Son of Thunder"
  - Jesus called James & John the "Sons of Thunder" hinting at their bold spirit.
- 3. **His Nickname Among The Apostles**James was called "the Greater" to distinguish him from St. James the Less.
- 4. Inner Circle
  - James was present at the Transfiguration and in the Garden of Gethsemane with Peter & John.
- 5. **First Apostle to Be Martyred** He was beheaded around 44 AD.
- 6. The Miracle after his death
  It is said to have appeared in a vision to help
  Christian forces win a battle in Spain.
- 7. Patron of Pilgrim
  - The Camino de Santiago leads to his shrine in Spain. Pilgrims often wear a scallop shell, his symbol.

# How does God speak to me?

Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice

come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, often God takes a much subtler approach.

In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, guiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood. # "DID YOU KNOW"

# from the Sacred Worship Committee

The Gloria prayer is generally sung at Sunday Masses outside of Advent and Lent, as well as during special occasions such as solemnities and feasts. Biblical references are numerous in this prayer. At Jesus' birth, the gospel of Luke 2:14 tells us the angels addressed the shepherds as they sang, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will." The next lines of "we praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory" were added by Christians in the second century. Then in response to Christ's saving mission, we thank God and proclaim him as Lord, heavenly King, and almighty Father. These titles for God; "almighty" and "heavenly King", are referred from the book of Psalms 24:7-10, 68:14, and Isaiah 43:15. Jesus is referred to as "the Holy One" (Rev. 3:7, 16:5; Jn 6:61, Mk 1:24; Lk 4:34) and "the Most High" (Gn 14:18; Ps 7:17). Jesus is proclaimed as Lord. By saying "you alone are the Lord", the Jewish people understood that our God alone is the Lord, and not the emperor, as the ancient Romans called their emperor Lord. Ancient Romans were expected to worship their emperor as Lord. Recall Thomas' proclamation when he saw Jesus resurrected, "My Lord and my God!" (Jn 20:28). Jesus is described as Lord and God in 1 Cor 8:6 and Phil 2:11. Next, Jesus is referred to as the "Only begotten Son". (Jn 5:17-18; 10:30-38; 2 Cor 1:19; Col 1:13; Heb 1:1-2). Within the Gloria prayer, we declare Jesus as the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world". These are the words of the great prophet John the Baptist calling out to Jesus as he was passing by, revealing to us that Jesus is the new Passover lamb, offering up his life on the cross for our sins. (Jn 1:29). Then, this prayer declares that Jesus is "seated at the right hand of the Father" (Mk 16:19), a position of authority (Ps 110:1, Heb 1:13). "A biblical walk through The Mass" by Edward Sri, is an excellent reference for people who wish to understand more deeply the biblical foundations for our Mass.

#### MARRIAGE:

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

#### **BAPTISM:**

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.

### ANNOINTING OF THE SICK:

If you or a loved one is in need of the Anointing Sacrament especially before a hospital stay or procedure - please contact the office.
