"DID YOU KNOW"

from the Sacred Worship Committee

This weekend we celebrate Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit is received by the Apostles and our Church officially begins. This account is captured in the book from the bible entitled "The Acts of the Apostles" written by St. Luke. This book temporally follows St. Luke's account of Jesus' Gospel. Luke was a close friend and confidant of St. Paul the apostle. He was trained as a physician and he spoke Greek, Aramaic, and Hebrew; his writings were in Greek. In the lectionary for our Sunday and daily masses, we read from chapters of Acts throughout the seven weeks of Easter season. (continued above...)

The first chapter of Acts begins with the Ascension of our Lord and the choosing of the apostle Mattias to replace Judas. Chapter 2 tells the story of Pentecost. From there, the story of teaching the Word and evangelization by the 12 apostles begins. One of the greatest opponents and persecutors of early Christians was Saul, to whom Jesus appeared. Jesus asked the key question, "Why are you persecuting me?" Henceforth, Saul was converted to Christianity and became one of the foremost proponents of our church. St. Paul is the writer of many epistles, or letters, in the New Testament. Think Ephesians, Corinthians, Colossians.

There are 28 action-filled chapters in the Acts of the Apostles, describing the trials, miracles and travels of the apostles with the subsequent conversion of many throughout eastern Asia, Greece and Rome. The historical significance of this book is grand, as it sets the stage for the understanding of writings of the remainder of the books of the New Testament. Acts provides us with an understanding of the difficulty early Christians had in spreading the Word of Jesus Christ, including martyrdom, torture and alienation. We read of many heroes, ordinary citizens who are moved by the teachings of the Way, who are transformed and are key to the establishment of the Church. 

Families Needed to Adopt a Prayer Table for Our Corpus Christi Procession:


