Faith Step

Scriptures, along with the tradition of the Catholic Church, form the theological basis for prayers for the souls in purgatory. The Church encourages the faithful to pray for these souls, believing that such intercessions can aid in their purification and help them enter heaven more quickly. Here are several biblical references that support the concept of praying for the dead and the existence of purgatory:

1 Corinthians 3:15 – Matthew 12:32 – 1 Peter 3:18-20. Check them out.

Did You Know?

From our Sacred Worship Committee

How do we gain a Plenary or Partial Indulgence for the Souls in Purgatory?

All Souls Day is a solemn celebration commemorating all those who have died and are now in Purgatory. Purgatory is where the soul waits with great torment for the longing to be with God. Souls in Purgatory cannot offer sacrifice or pray for themselves to be purified. It is up to the living to offer Mass, prayers, fasting & acts of mercy for those who died.

A great work of mercy is to pray for the dead. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (CCC 1030)

The Church grants a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, to the faithful who:

- On All Souls Day, November 2, devoutly visit a church and pray an Our Father and the Creed.
- From November 1 to 8, to those who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray for the departed.

A plenary indulgence offers the <u>complete remission</u> of all temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven.

A partial indulgence <u>speeds up the process of the perfection of a soul</u> but doesn't promise immediate release.

One may gain a **partial indulgence**, **applicable only to the souls in Purgatory** throughout the year by devoutly reciting the "Eternal Rest" prayer.

To obtain an Indulgence, one must:

- Be in the state of grace, having gone to Confession
- Receive Holy Communion
- Pray for the intentions of the Pope
- For Plenary indulgence, it is also necessary to have complete detachment from sin, even venial sin.
