

### KNOW YOUR SAINT Carlo Acutis (1991 – 2006)

- \* Born in 1991, was an ordinary teenager with an extraordinary love for the Eucharist.
- \* He called the Eucharist his "highway to heaven" & went to daily Mass whenever he could.
- \* He used his computer skills to create a website documenting Eucharistic miracles around the world.
- \* Known for his kindness, joy & generosity toward the poor.
- \* He died of leukemia at just 15 years old in 2006, offering his sufferings for the Church and the Pope.
- \* Beatified in 2020 & canonized on Sept. 7, 2025.
- \* Miracles that lead to his canonization were: healing of a boy with severe pancreatic malformation, and the healing of a woman from a severe head injury & brain hemorrhage.

Carlo is a model of how ordinary life, lived with extraordinary love, leads us closer to Christ.

### "DID YOU KNOW"

### from the Sacred Worship Committee

The three part dialogue recited as the opening to the Eucharistic Prayer: "The Lord be with you...And with your spirit" is used three times in the mass. We say this prayer in the Introductory Rites, just before reading the Gospel, and as the opening to the most sacred part of the mass, the Eucharistic Prayer. This greeting was used numerous times in the Old Testament as Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Joshua, King David, Jeremiah and the Blessed Virgin Mary were each called to important missions.

The priest then says, "Lift up your hearts", just as in the book of Lamentations: "Let us lift up our hearts and hands to God in heaven" (Lam 3:41). We are being summoned to give our fullest attention, to set aside all of our concerns and focus our hearts on what is about to happen. St. Paul instructs us in Colossians 3:2: "Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth". And so we reply, "We lift them up to the Lord".

Next the priest prays: "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God...". The Psalms show us that the people were asked to "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good..." (Ps 136: 1-3, Ps 107:8,15, 21, 31). The Jewish tradition teaches us that we receive many blessings, and the best we can offer is our thanks. From St. Paul we are taught to be "abounding in thanksgiving, giving thanks to God in all we do" and "in all circumstances" especially in worship. (Col 2:7, 3:17, 1 Thess 5:18, Phil 4:6, 1 Cor 14:16-29, Eph 5:19-20, Col 3:16). Surely, our response, "It is right and just" is well founded and the proper response for the introduction of the mysteries of the Eucharistic. This three part prayer is traced back to St. Hippolytus around 215 A.D. I invite you to focus on the roots and meaning of this prayer the next time you profess this 18 century old dialogue that is soundly based upon our Sacred Scripture.

### **FAITH STEP:**

When it looks like God is blessing somebody in a way that he's not blessing you, relax and trust God. Believe that he knows what's best for you, and trust him when life seems unfair. God has a good reason for why you don't have what you want. He knows you better than you know yourself, so you can practice praying, "God, I'm going to trust that you have a unique plan for my life and that you know better than me what I need right now."

Friend, I didn't cheat you. I paid you exactly what we agreed on. What business is it of yours if I want to pay them the same that I paid you? Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? (Matthew 20:13-15)

#### **MARRIAGE:**

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the office at the time of engagement, at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered parish member, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish at least 3 months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

#### **BAPTISM:**

Parents may request the baptism of their infant at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. Family should be members of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of our parish. To request baptism, please call the parish office at 715-824-3455.
