

In preparation for the end of 2025 calendar year, please remember that donations/offerings must be received (or postmarked if mailed) by December 31st in order to be deductible for 2025. If posted after December 31st, regardless of the date on the check, the contributions will be considered a 2025 deductible. Please remember that all ADA payments for 2025 must be postmarked by December 31, 2025 and be received at the Diocese offices by January 5th, 2026 in order to be credited for the 2025 tax year.
