LITURGY CHANGES DUE TO COVID-19 (CORONA) VIRUS:

Archbishop Joseph Kurtz guidelines affecting public Masses remains unchanged. **Suspension of public celebrations of the Holy Eucharist are still in effect until further notice.** For the faithful at All Saints parish, the following is offered:

- Father Johnny continues to say Mass privately each day and offer them for Mass intentions.
- **Mass for Sunday (May 3) will be live-streamed on All Saints Facebook Page, beginning at 12 Noon. You must join All Saints Facebook page—see the website link.**
- Also available for you is Mass of the Air (see note on left) and daily recitation of the Holy Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet.
- Confessions can be heard by appointment only, using proper safeguards for hygiene and social distancing. If this is not an option, you may effect a Perfect Act of Contrition. This requires a sincere desire for forgiveness and the firm intention to make a regular confession when safe to do so.
- No distribution of Holy Communion to the sick and homebound.
- Spiritual Communion is encouraged (see bulletin, page 2)
- The White Book for Easter and the Word Among Us (Easter Edition) are available for pickup on the bench in front of St. Benedict Hall from 1-3PM Monday-Wednesday until they are gone. Also available at that time are blessed palms from Palm Sunday. All items are in limited quantities.

How to Make an Act of Spiritual Communion: While unable to attend Mass during this time, an Act of Spiritual Communion may be made while watching a broadcast of the Mass on the Air, over the Internet, on Facebook, or during morning and evening prayers when the time for communion comes. A spiritual communion is a devotion we can perform whether we are at Mass and not receiving the Eucharist sacramentally or we are anywhere else. *Recite the prayer as follows:*

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Catechism Corner: What is Truth?



Truth is defined by more than just the absence of a lie. It is represented by The Eighth Commandment, which forbids misrepresenting the truth in our relations with others: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor" (**CCC 2464**) The Old Testament attests that God is the source of all truth. His Word is truth. His law is truth. His "faithfulness endures to all generations." Since God is "true," the

members of his people are called to live in the truth. (**CCC 2465**) In Jesus Christ, the whole of God's truth has been made manifest. "Full of grace and truth," he came as the "light of the world," he *is the Truth*. "Whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness." The disciple of Jesus continues in his word so as to know "the truth [that] will make you free" and that sanctifies. To follow Jesus is to live in "the Spirit of truth," whom the Father sends in his name and who leads "into all the truth." To his disciples Jesus teaches the unconditional love of truth: "Let what you say be simply 'Yes or No.'" (**CCC 2466**) Man tends by nature toward the truth. He is obliged to honor and bear witness to it: "It is in accordance with their dignity that all men, because they are persons...are both impelled by their nature and bound by a moral obligation to seek the truth, especially religious truth. They are also bound to adhere to the truth once they come to know it and direct their whole lives in accordance with the demands of truth." (**CCC 2467**) Truth as uprightness in human action and speech is called truthfulness, sincerity, or candor. Truth or truthfulness is the virtue which consists in showing oneself true in deeds and truthful in words, and in guarding against duplicity, dissimulation, and hypocrisy. (**CCC 2468**) "Men could not live with one another if there were not mutual confidence that they were being truthful to one another." The virtue of truth gives another his just due. Truthfulness keeps to the just mean between what ought to be expressed and what ought to be kept secret: it entails honesty and discretion. In justice "as a matter of honor, one man owes it to another to manifest the truth." (**CCC 2469**) The disciple of Christ consents to "live in the truth," that is, in the simplicity of a life in conformity with the Lord's example, abiding in his truth. "If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth." (**CCC 2470**)




