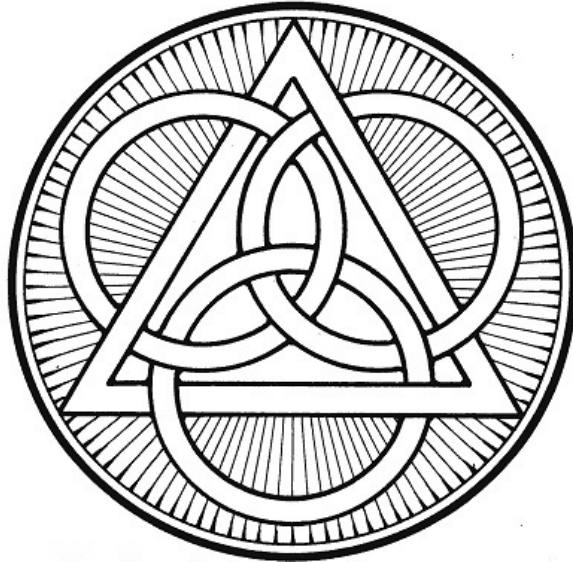

**FIRST READING**

*Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9*

A reading from the Book of Exodus.

Early in the morning Moses went up Mount Sinai  
as the LORD had commanded him,  
taking along the two stone tablets.

Having come down in a cloud, the LORD stood with Moses there  
and proclaimed his name, "LORD."

Thus the LORD passed before him and cried out,  
"The LORD, the LORD, a merciful and gracious God,  
slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity."

Moses at once bowed down to the ground in worship.

Then he said, "If I find favor with you, O Lord,  
do come along in our company.

This is indeed a stiff-necked people; yet pardon our wickedness and sins,  
and receive us as your own."

*Éxodo 34, 4-6. 8-9*

Lectura del libro del Éxodo.

Al instante, Moisés se postró en tierra y lo adoró, diciendo: “Si de veras he hallado gracia a tus ojos, dígnate venir ahora con nosotros, aunque este pueblo sea de cabeza dura; perdona nuestras iniquidades y pecados, y tómanos como cosa tuya”.

in accordance with the Scriptures.**

**He ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead  
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,  
who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.**

**I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.  
I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins  
and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead  
and the life of the world to come.**

among whom you have been scattered. **R/.**

When you turn back to him with all your heart,  
to do what is right be-fore him,  
then he will turn back to you,  
and no longer hide his face from you. **R/.**

So now consider what he has done for you,  
and praise him with full voice.

Bless the Lord of righteousness,  
and exalt the King of the ages. **R/.**

In the land of my exile I praise him,

“Turn back, you sinners! Do right before him:  
perhaps he may look with favor upon you and show you mercy. **R/.**

Let all men speak of his majesty,  
and sing his praises in Jerusalem.” **R/.**

O Jerusalem, holy city,  
he scourged you for the works of your hands,  
but will again pity the children of the righteous. **R/.**

Praise the Lord for his goodness,  
and bless the King of the ages,  
so that his tent may be rebuilt in you with joy. **R/.**

May he gladden within you all who were captives;  
all who were ravaged may he cherish with-in you  
for all generations to come. **R/.**

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,  
as it was in the beginning, is now,  
and will be fore-ver. Amen. **R/.**
