#### **REFLECTION**

By Fr. Rich Jasper Fifth Sunday of Easter - May 16, 2025

#### Habemus Papam

It might be fair to say that we were all a little stunned with the news last Thursday that our Holy Father – whom the world now knows as Pope Leo XIV – is a Chicagoan by birth and educated at nearby Villanova University. One of our Outreach volunteers said to me in passing: "Father, I never thought I'd live to see the day that an American would be named pope." Then, after a brief pause, "I guess I can check that off my list!"

If you were able to watch Pope Leo stand on the balcony overlooking St. Peter's Square (and the world) on the day of his election, you could see in his eyes how visibly moved he was by the responsibility that has been placed upon his shoulders, not unlike the Cross. He is now shepherd for all of us, caring for every soul and making sure we find our way to the Father, both here and in the hereafter.

I was struck, as you were, that the first word our Holy Father offered the Church and the world was the word "peace," the very same "shalom" that the risen Christ offered to his apostles in their time of fear, doubt and worry. It was as if he was saying to all of us: "I know how your hearts are feeling in this present age; let Christ into that space of fear; He alone can offer light and hope."

The other moment that moved me deeply was that, toward the end of his first address, he spoke in Spanish to the people of the diocese in Peru where he first became bishop. Ever the shepherd, he said to them: "you are a faithful people that accompanied [me], shared your faith, and gave so, so much to being a Church that is faithful to Jesus Christ." As I heard this translated, I thought to myself: I could say the very same thing about the good people of Immaculate Conception and St. Jude.

In the days and weeks ahead, no doubt, there will be many "Vatican experts" and "papal pundits" who will be evaluating the Holy Father's past writings, homilies and social media accounts to see where he stands on a host of issues facing our modern age. Let us never forget in the midst of this that he needs our prayers and our love more than ever. After all, when all is said and done, isn't that what we do for each other in our best moments as a family, as Catholics, and even as Americans? We pray for each other and stay grounded in the love of God.

May I also suggest this? As Pope Leo ended his speech with a prayer to Our Lady of Pompeii on her feast, may we in this month dedicated to our Lady and worshipping in a parish dedicated to her, offer this prayer for our Holy Father's faithfulness, courage and protection:

O, Queen of Victories and of the Holy Rosary, we pour out our hearts to you. Have compassion on the sorrows and cares which embitter our lives. Implore for us the Mercy of your Divine Son and conquer with clemency the hearts of sinners. Have pity on us and the whole world so that we may return, repentantly, to your heart and that of your Son's. May Pope Leo XIV lead us to the holiness we are called to live as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ. Amen.

Disciples then went forth to tell the Gentiles to honor only those rules which were strictly necessary, such as abstaining from eating meat sacrificed to idols and illicit sexual union.

#### Second Reading: Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

John depicts Jerusalem coming out of heaven, sparkling with the radiance of precious jewels. Angels were stationed at each of its twelve gates, and each gate bore the name of one tribe of Israel. The city had no temple, because God was its temple. The glory and light of God and the Lamb also replaced their need for the sun.

#### Gospel: John 14:23-29

Jesus tells his disciples, "Anyone who loves me will be true to my word." For those who do honor his word, both Jesus and God will love them and stay with them always. He also tells them that God will send the Holy Spirit in his place to give them the instructions they will need. Jesus then tells them that peace is his farewell gift to them.


