# A Message from Monsignor

As a priest I often read obituaries, and when I do, I look for several things. I look for the funerals I am doing; I look for the Catholics; I look for friends; and I really look for the funny ones. Sometimes they are not intentionally funny, but I find what

they say about an individual amusing or how they try to phrase what happened...answered the call, entered into glory, went home, passed on, etc.

I know words are feeble in expressing our hope for the hereafter and what awaits our loved ones, but November gives us the opportunity to express it with more than just words, we do so in the liturgy. During our masses this All Saints Day and All Souls Day, indeed throughout the whole month of November, we will express our hope for our loved ones in the Great Harvest of Souls. The Holy Eucharist is a perfect way to express our belief in the Paschal Mystery, the saving passion and death of Christ along with His resurrection which makes our very hope

The element of the Eucharist which is gratitude also reminds us to be thankful for the blessing of ever having been together with family and friends. I have learned time, and particularly gratitude, tempers our grief. Of this much I am sure that while our grief may never be totally eliminated, the grief there is in parting will pale in comparison to the joy of meeting again.

Back to the funny obits...some of favorites include a sweet, senior lady's photo accompanied by the text "Mary Pat was world renowned for her lack of patience, not holding back her opinion and a knack for tell it like it is." Another person used their police mug shot photo for the obit and another said "He was a connoisseur of root beer and bacon." What would you have people say

about you at the end of your life? It's a troubling thought. I see two options – writing my own obituary or changing my ways. It's probably not a bad

thought for all of us as we celebrate the Feast of All Saints. What might we need to change

in order to be counted among their number? Regarding the Feast of All Souls Day, we Maga. Mauseuce might ask "Who do we miss the most and why?" Who has gone before me in faith that I most admire and esteem and how can I imitate the virtue in their lives. I may have to pour myself a root beer and have some bacon and think about that myself.

**CROP Walk is SPX Strong!** The Greensboro CROP Hunger Walk is much more than raising money for a good cause, service hours earned or going out for a walk on a Sunday afternoon! It is a community gathering event of our SPX family, along with our greater community, to raise awareness for hunger, to help end poverty, and to promote peace and justice. It is the second largest CROP event in the nation, attracting more than 4,000 walkers each year. St. Pius X Catholic Church was at least

# **Expanded Adult Faith Formation and Bible Study Programs in Full Swing**

The Adult Faith Formation program at St. Pius X has expanded and grown this year. Based on a survey of parishioners earlier in the year, four primary study areas were identified that attracted the most interest:

**Bible Studies:** Courses on individual books of the Bible, in particular the Gospels, and the very popular "Bible Timeline" course have been, and will continue to be offered regularly. Participants in these programs often return to take additional courses attesting to the desire to understand Scriptures more in a supportive, informative, Catholic group setting.

**History of the Church:** The "EPIC" course from Ascension Press is being offered for the first time here. This course also uses a timeline to trace the history of the Catholic Church (the highs, the lows, the good, the bad, the great, and the beautiful) over the past 2,000 years.

Learning Catholic Faith: There are many aspects of our faith that, while being biblically based, combine teaching from Scriptures with the historical tradition, wisdom, and evolved doctrine of the Church. This includes things like devotion to the Blessed Mother, the meaning of the Eucharist, and teachings from the Catechism or the Second Vatican Council. These courses, including the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation) classes, all appeal to anyone who is seeking a deeper understanding of Catholic Faith.

Living a Catholic Life: St. James famously reminds us that "works" in addition to faith are marks of a true follower of Jesus. Courses are offered that address Catholic prayer life, raising a Catholic family, even how to manage our finances with a Catholic perspective.

New courses will start in January- watch the bulletin for details. All are invited and welcome to participate in these programs – bring a friend or a spouse!

# **Food Cart Fills Empty Shelves and Hungry Tummies**

During the month of September, St. Pius X donated 1,229 lbs. of food in our Food Cart. Just figure an average can weighs 16 oz. or 1 lb. 1,229 lbs. is great! This food helps Greensboro Urban Ministry serve 100 families each day through the Emergency Assistance Program. Several families volunteered at the Fall Food Drive at Food Lion and in one
