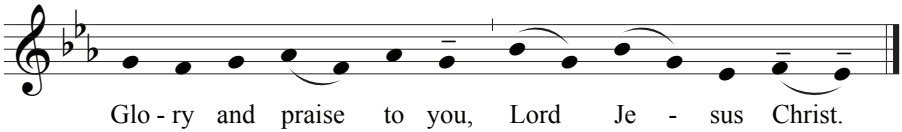

Nicene Creed

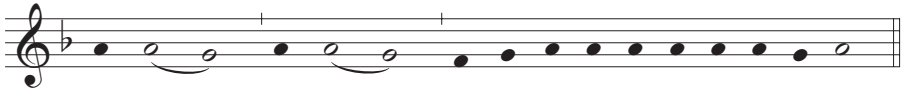



Lord's Prayer


