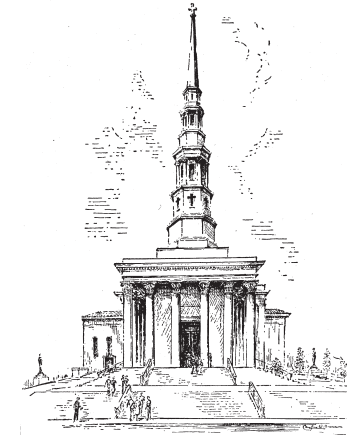



Profession of Faith

Nicene Creed






