The Ancient Office of Tenebrae

Wednesday, April 17 at 7:30 pm in the cathedral. This unique Holy Week service features the gradual extinction of all the lights and candles in the cathedral symbolizing the temporary triumph of the prince of darkness over the Light of the World, and the loud noise, or strepitus, at the conclusion suggesting the earthquake described in the Passion narratives. A single candle left burning is the symbol and promise of Christ’s triumph over death and darkness. The service includes the praying of psalms, scripture readings, the chanting of the *Lamentations* and the singing of a cappella chants and choral music sung by the Cathedral Choir. Reverend Raymond Larger will preside. All are welcome.
