Lent has now come to an end and the Church, at this Mass of the Lord's Supper, enters into the sacred Paschal Triduum. From the very first moment the all-embracing experience of the three days is proclaimed: "We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life, and our resurrection; through him we are saved and made free." This is the whole of the great Triduum. On this night the liturgy draws us toward this through the scriptures, through the mandatum or foot washing which is the direct expression of our service to one another and the world, and through the great eucharistic banquet itself.
