


You set your love on me so I will save you, protect you for you know my name. When you call I shall answer "I am with you," I will save you in distress and give you glory.



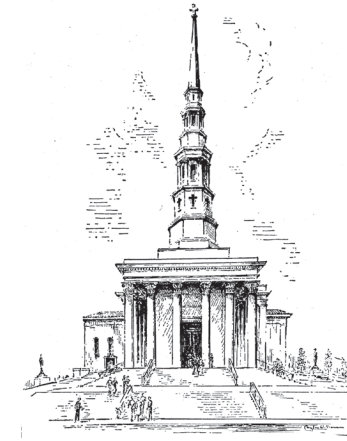
**Prayer for Vocations**


