

State of the Pro-Life Struggle - Part 1



On January 22nd of this year, just over a week from today, we will be observing the 45th anniversary of the horrendous U.S. Supreme Court decisions that invented a so-called constitutional "right" to kill an innocent child in the womb for essentially any reason. The result? 60 million defenseless babies

killed. I am completely unapologetic about drawing attention to this fact (despite occasional complaints from parishioners). In fact, I believe I have a duty to do so as a priest of Jesus Christ. There is an argument, unfortunately gaining some traction, that says that we should soft pedal this issue in order to "seek common ground" or "avoid controversy," since so many who profess to be Christians are indifferent or even opposed to the pro-life message. I strongly disagree. That is not how the Apostles proclaimed the Gospel when Christ mandated them to "teach all nations," and it is not something we as Catholics can do now.

Some great pro-life leaders frequently remind us that the reason we have made only very slow progress in resolving this gravest of moral injustices is that the truth is hidden about this. That is by design. The wicked people who advocate abortion (including many prominent and "respectable" politicians, Planned Parenthood officials, corporate heads, major media directors and so on) want to hide the truth from people. Part of the prophetic witness of those baptized into Christ is – like John the Baptist himself – to unmask evil which is hiding underneath the often slick exterior of these very powerful folks (read Mark 6:14-29).

I will be writing about this in the next two columns, and want to start with a bit of a "state of the union" in the battle to protect life in the womb. First, some good news: On the political front, with the change of administrations our new president has moved quickly to reinstate some pro-life protections which his (aggressively pro-abortion) predecessor had removed. He has also appointed many pro-life federal judges, including one Supreme Court justice, to begin reversing the impact of the exclusively (often radically) pro-abortion appointments of that predecessor. There has been a slight decrease in the number of abortions committed in Ohio (about 1%). The nationwide trend may be similar. So we are making

incremental progress.

But over 1 million abortions per year is completely unacceptable. No society can survive if it attacks its most vulnerable. The obvious question, then, is, Why are we complicit in this grave evil? It should shock us that 37% of Planned Parenthood's \$1.46 billion funding comes from you, the taxpayer. You read that right: We taxpayers are paying over \$500 million each year to support this attack on the innocent. Why is this outrage allowed to continue? Because, quite frankly, one of our major political parties is propping the abortionists up on ideological principle, and the greatest offender – Planned Parenthood – claims that they are a "women's health organization," which provides much-needed prenatal care. Let's drill into their patently false claim and pull the covers back to reveal the truth. Their own data show that they do only one adoption referral for every 83 abortions committed. Worse, they provide prenatal care for only one woman for every 239 abortions they commit. In fact, they routinely turn away women seeking prenatal services, or seeking ultrasounds (because they know that once a woman sees her baby, she is extremely unlikely to kill him or her). Creative accounting and propaganda claims aside, they are clearly in the business of making money off abortion. Worse, despite the major media trying to cover up the story – and politicians especially in California and New York trying to attack and penalize the whistle blowers – they even stoop to outrageous lows to profit from the sale of the body parts of aborted children.

This is truly scandalous, so much so that it makes it difficult to claim that we are a Christian nation if we allow this to continue. What should we do about this? That's the topic for next week's column, but we can start by applying persistent pressures to those who represent us to correct the problem, and refusing to vote for those who would enable it, no matter what other good things they stand for.
