

## Pentecost

Today the Church around the world celebrates the great feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit first inflamed the Church with the divine power of God in a very dramatic way. This is hugely important in the life of the Church, so much so that (like Easter itself), the Church used to celebrate it for eight straight days. Unfortunately, coming near the beginning of summer vacation season, it tends to get lost in the shuffle.

Why is it so important? The short answer is because the Holy Spirit is so important: as one of the Persons of the Holy Trinity, He is God Himself, and the One who draws us into the depths of God's love for us. The first great Pentecost was celebrated on a Jewish Feast of Weeks, 50 days after Passover, where the people observed the great gift of God's law to Moses. We have something far greater than just the law: the Holy Spirit allows us to share personally in the inner life of God Himself.

One of our past presidents, Ronald Reagan, was sometimes nicknamed "the Great Communicator" for his rhetorical skills. But the real "Great Communicator" is the Holy Spirit, because He communicates God's love in the literal sense of that word: 'to make one with.' He is the One who keeps us united to God the Father and to Christ His Son. Perfectly in fact (at least to the extent that we don't throw any obstacles in His way!).

The Catechism teaches us that the Holy Spirit ushers us "into the 'last days', the time of the Church, the Kingdom already inherited though not yet consummated." [#732] That means that the Church becomes the living vessel of the Holy Spirit, the very presence of God, promised to those who are baptized, believe in Christ, and are receptive to His will. We are not in Heaven yet, but those who remain faithful to His Church, through the power of the Holy Spirit, remain very close, and eagerly await the fulfillment of the promises of Heaven.

When I was a high school student at Detroit Jesuit, we had pep rallies in the school gymnasium, to get us fired up about the big game coming up on the weekend. The enthusiasm was a bit contrived and manufactured, of course. But the Holy Spirit does something different: He fires us up not with a "rah-rah" emotional buzz, but with the real, soul-deep love of God dwelling within us, and with the enthusiasm to remain united to Jesus Christ on earth so we can be with Him in Heaven. Along the way, He gives us many fruits and spiritual powers: love, joy, peace, kindness, gentleness, self-control and more.

But there is a very necessary "first step" to be able to live the joy-filled life in the Spirit: that is the forgiveness of sins. The Church very dramatically – but accurately – describes us as dead in sin – or at least wounded – until we receive the forgiveness of the Holy Spirit and are restored to unity with the Church. (We can't be united to God until we are united with the Church first). And that is why so many people don't exhibit the gifts of the Spirit and the joy of being truly Christian: because they won't go to confession first to receive the Holy Spirit. It is a little bit like expecting to live a perfectly healthy life and never going to a doctor for medicine and treatment! During this Pentecost period, don't forget to go to confession, so you can be filled with the Holy Spirit.

## A Closer Look


### Why have holy water and what is it?

Holy water is water that is blessed by a priest, bishop, or deacon. It is a sacramental, or religious object or action that the Catholic Church created. While the seven Sacraments were created by Jesus. When entering or leaving a church, Catholics dip their right hand, usually two fingers, into a font, a cup of holy water that's on a wall near the doors of the church. Then they make the sign of the cross, wetting their forehead, breast, and shoulders. In doing so, they visibly remind themselves that they're entering the House of God. Plus, it is a reminder of their baptism and is good in preparing for worship. Although the Church does use holy water to drive out demons on rare occasions, it more regularly uses holy water to sanctify (bless) objects, to protect people from supernatural evil, and to serve as a symbolic reminder of Baptism.
