

## Catholic Perspectives on Independence Day

I recently came across an interesting article about Mark Zuckerberg, the founder of Facebook. (I personally don't care for social media, because I strongly prefer personal

contact to the electronic 'browsing,' but I know it is wildly popular. But that is a column for another day.) He recently gave a graduation speech at Harvard, the school he dropped out of, and said this: "It's not enough to have purpose yourself. You also have to create a sense of purpose for others." Although Mr. Zuckerberg appears to be becoming somewhat interested in religious things as of late, that is certainly a secular perspective. To the secular world, we create and invent purpose for ourselves. But Christians have a different perspective: God created us with a purpose, we don't have to create or invent it. It is quite simply "to know, love, and serve Him in this life and to be happy with Him forever in the next."

It is somewhat similar with the notions of 'freedom' and 'independence.' We Americans sometimes glory in 'freedom' meaning not having an external power rule over us (as England did when we were a colony), or 'not having anybody tell us what to do' (as teenagers struggling to be independent from their parents sometimes dream of). But that is again not very much. As Christians, we set our sights much higher: true freedom means being able to love and serve God with no obstacles to stand in the way. That is what sin really is: habits and actions that prevent us from achieving our potential to love God. So to be truly

free, we need to be bound to the practice of our faith, which – through prayer, the sacraments and the intercession and example of the saints – truly does help to make us free.

I recommend for your Independence Day reading some excerpts from the Church's Catechism on freedom and responsibility. They remind us that our freedom does not mean being able to do whatever we want (no matter how morally repugnant. (This is increasingly and unfortunately the view of our American culture, which glorifies in self-satisfaction). Rather, we are only truly free when our choices are oriented to God's commandments and His will (towards the good).

Here are the excerpts. #1731-33: Freedom is the power, rooted in reason and will, to act or not to act, to do this or that, and so to perform deliberate actions on one's own responsibility. By free will one shapes one's own life. Human freedom is a force for growth and maturity in truth and goodness; it attains its perfection when directed toward God, our beatitude. As long as freedom has not bound itself definitively to its ultimate good which is God, there is the possibility of choosing between good and evil, and thus of growing in perfection or of failing and sinning. This freedom characterizes properly human acts. It is the basis of praise or blame, merit or reproach. The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. There is no true freedom except in the service of what is good and just. The choice to disobey and do evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to "the slavery of sin."




## How does OLV attract people who consider becoming Catholic?
