

CO-CREATORS WITH GOD



This week includes the feast day of Ss. Joachim and Anne, the father and mother of Mary the Mother of God. Because our Scriptures are completely silent on this point, we can only imagine the great joy that they experienced in bringing into this world this most precious of God's creatures. Tradition even tells us that St. Anne was infertile for many years and may have expected never to have a child, so how much greater the joy when the Lord finally gave to them this priceless of gifts.

Because of that feast day, our American bishops have chosen this week to highlight the Church's beautiful teaching on the conception and procreation of children in marriage. There is absolutely no question that we need to "get the word out" on this good news and beautiful doctrine, because our culture is certainly rejecting it at its core and even many young Catholic couples either don't understand it in the slightest or reject it as completely unworkable, as they see so few of their friends embracing it.

At its root, the teaching is that the marital union between a husband and wife must always remain fundamentally open to God's life-giving gift and remain an instrument of the power of His creative love. We of course live in a culture where so many couples (even otherwise faithful Catholics) go to one of two extremes. They either trivialize the sexual union, blocking out the self-giving with pills and barriers, so that it becomes just a recreational act; or, on the other hand, they try to "produce" a child – at exactly the time and place in the marriage where they see fit, as if God has nothing to do with it. We even see terrible extremes now of people having children in immoral ways completely separated from the loving marital act of a man and a woman.

These anti-Christian outlooks on marriage are so deeply entrenched in our culture that it takes some time to "untangle them" and understand just how damaging they are and, on the flipside, how much happier couples would be if they practiced Christ's teaching.

A good place to start to is the U.S. Bishops' webpage on "natural family planning awareness" linked to our parish website, www.olv.org, or available at <http://www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/marriage-and-family/natural-family-planning/awareness-week>. I particularly recommend the articles section, especially the one by Dr. Janet Smith on the richness of Church teaching on procreation.

Here's just an excerpt of hers to whet your appetite:

The Church's teaching on contraception is not just a doctrine that states what not to do. Many people would benefit from knowing that it is a doctrine that explains how extraordinarily important is the act of having children. One reason that modern culture has trouble understanding ... is that it fails to appreciate what a profound good children are. It is true that most parents love their children beyond belief and frequently even acknowledge that they are great gifts from God. Many parents will testify that when they held their baby for the first time, they experience a rush of love matched by little else. But they do not always realize that in having children they are "co-creators" with God. ... A human life is of inestimable value; a human soul is destined to share a blissful eternity with God, the angels and saints. Only God can create a new human soul but he needs the help of human beings to bring forth a new person. When engaging in sexual intercourse spouses are inviting God to perform his creative act of bringing a new human soul into existence: they supply the sperm and egg; God provides the soul.



NFP AWARENESS WEEK: JULY 23-29, 2017

What is NFP? Natural Family Planning (NFP) is an umbrella term for the safe, natural and effective methods of both achieving and avoiding pregnancy. NFP methods teach couples how to observe and interpret the woman's signs of fertility and infertility. In the words of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, NFP methods "respect the bodies of the spouses, encourage tenderness between them and favor the education of an authentic freedom." (CCC, no. 2370)

NFP is a holistic approach to family planning. Both husband and wife understand their fertility, emotions, and family planning intention (whether to have a baby or not). Its successful use to avoid pregnancy relies upon a couple's following what they know about the method and one another. Successful use of NFP requires a couple to communicate. In the daily charting of their fertility signs, couples quickly appreciate their shared responsibility for family planning. Husbands are encouraged to "tune into" their wives' cycles, and both spouses are encouraged to speak openly to each other about their sexual desires and their ideas on family size.



NFP promotes openness to the transmission of human life and recognizes the value of children. Sexual relations are understood as love-giving as well as life-giving. It is true family planning. Because NFP respects the twofold nature of sexual intercourse, it can enrich the bond between husband and wife. Indeed, it can be said that NFP promotes the understanding of "self donation" between spouses. For these reasons it is an acceptable form of family planning for people of various religious and philosophical beliefs.
