

Christmas and the Family



Due to a quirk of the calendar (Christmas falling on Monday this year) we have the two "family" holidays of the Christmas season back to back: First, the celebration of the feast of the Holy Family on Sunday, immediately followed by the

solemn feast of Mary, the Mother of God, the next day. Together, both of them show us that God's plan to bring us to the happiness of Heaven depend on fatherhood and motherhood and the love of the family.

That is what the Christian family is, or at least what we should strive to be as disciples of Jesus Christ the newborn King: a mutually supportive community to help each other be united to the Holy Trinity both in this life and in eternity. Here's what the Catechism says about the mission and purpose of the family:

The Christian family is a communion of persons, a sign and image of the communion of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. In the procreation and education of children it reflects the Father's work of creation. It is called to partake of the prayer and sacrifice of Christ. Daily prayer and the reading of the Word of God strengthen it in charity. The Christian family has an evangelizing and missionary task. [2205]

There's a lot packed into that one-paragraph description. It says that the love of the Christian family is meant to mirror (image) the very nature of God. Because even though God is one, He is also three Persons. God is a "Communion" - the mutual love of the Father for the Son, pouring out into the Person of the Holy Spirit. So the love of family members for each other makes us like God, even as it is God's gift and grace that allows to love each other fully, even when it is difficult. That's the "sign" and witness part. God wants our family love to shine forth so that, when other people see the way the husband, wife and children love each other, they see the beauty of God living in the world. (This is the "evangelizing" and missionary task.") It goes even deeper: because God gives to a husband and wife in

their marital act the ability to bring children into the word, new life made in His image and likeness and infinitely precious, this man and woman share in God's very act of creation. The Church even uses the term "co-creators with God of new human life." That is a tremendous privilege and responsibility and explains why the Church constantly re-echoes Jesus' commandments to bring children into the world only in the context of the life-long love of a man and a woman for their children. (Sexual relations are nothing to be trifled with, despite our media and culture constantly bombarding our young people with this lie. Counterfeits for marriage cohabitation, same-sex unions and so on violate God's plan). But it is not just conceiving children that allows us to share in God's creation: the education of children is necessary as well. That's referring not just to sending them to schools for academic opportunities and sports programs, but above all to train them to know God and to follow His commandments, including all of the teachings of the Church. Because God entrusts children to parents for a purpose: so that they can glorify God by cocreating citizens of Heaven. If the parents don't do everything in their power to teach their children to follow Christ and obey His Church, their God-given mission can't be fulfilled.

That is why the last part of the Catechism section is so key, even though it is (sadly) so widely ignored in our Catholic families today. The family exists to teach children to pray and sacrifice for Christ. Not just at the Catholic schools, but in the home. Family prayer and reading of the Scriptures together is key, most especially the family Rosary. ("The family that prays together stays together!"). I would be surprised if even 10% of our parish families are doing that, and it is my challenge to you to increase that number. If you want your children and grandchildren to be in Heaven, it is extremely important to do so.



- When you approach for communion, please use the priest's communion line since he will have the pyx attached to his ciborium. Once you are at the front of the line, tell him you need a celiac host.
- If you can only receive the Precious Blood, please come forward at the end of the communion line and inform the priest or deacon. They will retrieve the chalice from the altar and provide it to you.




