



An Undivided Heart

We all know the format of the Sunday Mass: the liturgy of the word has three Scripture readings. To be honest, though, I don't think anyone really remembers the middle one, sandwiched in between the Old Testament and the Gospel. That's unfortunate, because it is usually a letter from St. Paul to the early churches, with great practical advice on what it means to be a Christian and how to get to heaven. Even though they were written almost 2,000 years ago, they are still helpful today. Last Sunday, there was a great reading on a topic that comes up frequently for modern Catholics: why certain people who serve the Church should not marry. Curiously, I have almost never heard anyone object to the fact that



nuns remain unmarried and consecrated to God. But many Catholics in the pews are convinced that parish priests should be allowed to marry. So it's a fair question: why not? St. Paul's letter from last Sunday's Mass helps to answer that question. (I Corinthians 7): "Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxiety. An unmarried man troubles himself with the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man troubles himself with the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided. An unmarried woman ... troubles herself about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. A married woman, on the other hand, troubles herself with the things of the world, how she may please her husband. I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction."

This gets at the heart of the gift of celibacy for the sake of the Kingdom. It is not a "running away" from marriage, or holding it in contempt, but instead a recognition that the great sacrifice made by those called to the priesthood and religious life has a purpose, a purpose even higher than the beautiful goals of marriage and family life: to consecrate oneself in an undivided way to the service of God and His holy Church. We might say that the married life serves God indirectly (we show our love for God by the way we love our spouse and children), while the celibate life serves God directly – for example, in freeing up the priest or religious brother or sister to pray more intensely, for their own growth in holiness and the sanctification of the people.

This has a very practical side. The Church requires that all priests – even busy parish priests – pray five times a day. I don't resent this at all, even though it is very challenging with my busy schedule. It helps remind me that my most important work – after the Mass and the sacraments – is to pray for my people. And it reminds me that my work is useless if it is not united to Christ in prayer. But quite frankly, if I had to attend to a family and offer these prayers, I think I would resent them. It would become a bothersome duty, and I am quite sure that my wife (and children or grandchildren) would resent it if I were spending a great deal of time in Church in prayer and not spending time with them at home, on the soccer field, at their plays, college visits, etc. etc. In short, there would constantly be a feeling of being divided between serving God and serving my family.

I think that the reason that so many modern Catholics say that they are in favor of married priests is that they don't know that priests pray. They may see only a very narrow view of the priestly life, as a kind of "meeting and sacrament coordinator." For instance, they often encounter them only when they are saying Mass or at a parish social event. They don't see them at 5:30 in the morning when they are in Church praying or 2:00 in the afternoon when they are praying for the people they just visited in the hospital or anointed at their bedside while they were dying or the parishioner in a crisis. But the centuries-old practice of priestly celibacy, which allows priests to serve with an undivided heart, has a very firm foundation in our tradition and Scripture. Something even St. Paul saw in the 1st century.

It is a gift not only to the priest himself, to allow him to enter into Communion with the Lord, but one for the people of the parishes as well.





Results of the Fall 2017 OLV School Survey

Thanks to all that provided feedback on our school via the survey we conducted last fall. This information is critical in helping us continue our legacy of providing excellent Catholic-based education as we have since our founding 175 years ago. We've done an initial review of the material and offer the following results and insights:


- A total of 180 responses were received:
 - •88% were parishioners
 - •84% were parents of current students
 - •24% were parents of past students
 - •9 % were parents of prospective students
- Reasons for selecting OLV school include:
 - •Strong Catholic education (65%)
 - Academic reputation (50%)
 - •Parents are grads of OLV school (36%)
 - •Recommended by friends or family (34%)
 - •Specific programs offered (19%)
 - Affordability (9%)
- 63% attended the Open House before deciding to enroll
 - •59% indicated the Open House was important in making their decision
- 95% of respondents said they heard of OLV school because it is their Parish, in their neighborhood, or parents are grads of OLV
- Parents consider many other schools before choosing OLV, with the majority considering Oak Hills, St. Antoninus, St. Dominic, and Our Lady of the Visitation.
- When rating the importance of features of an OLV education, respondents indicated the following with the greatest number of "high" votes:
 - Catholic environment
 - Technology
 - Art/Music/Gym
 - Enrichment
 - Kindergarten
 - •Junior High electives
 - •Fulltime nurse
 - Math & reading specialists and psychologist
- 47% considered themselves well informed regarding the operation/activities of the school, with 48% moderately and 4% minimally informed
- The highest methods of receiving information are:
 - Voice of Victory (97%)
 - •Email (78%)
 - •Other school families (69%)
 - •OLV website (64%)
 - Church bulletin (64%)
 - •Facebook (52%)

The areas suggested for improvement in communications include:

- Website
- •Facebook/Social Media
- Voice of Victory
- •Neeb Road Message Board
- Newspaper

Results of the Fall 2017 OLV School Survey



- Regarding tuition, 80% thought it about right, with 20% thinking it too high
- 72% think the fact that OLV graduates were valedictorians at their high schools last year would influence their decision to enroll a child at OLV school
- Regarding written comments, the main themes are:
 - •Catholic identity is important
 - Discipline is important
 - •Academic quality/rigor is important
 - •Communication is important
 - •Parents consider other schools when their children become school age

We will continue the analysis of the feedback in detail while reviewing our current operations and our planning for the future.

Initiatives that are currently under way that respond to some of the feedback include:

- •Amending the discipline policy in the handbook to be clearer regarding the steps in the discipline program.
- •Instituting a positive behavior recognition program to enhance the discipline policy.
- •Scheduling a bullying seminar for students and parents in early 2018.
- •Adjusting the Open House program to be more accommodating to prospective families/students.
- •Formalizing the program to improve the appearance of the school environment, building on the extensive work done last summer.
- •Creating a process with the local Catholic high schools to get yearly feedback on the preparedness of OLV graduates and to adjust curriculum as necessary (meetings already held with Seton and Elder).
- •Increase the effectiveness of the preparation course for the High School Placement Test (HSPT).
- •Begin the investigation into replacing the Neeb Road message board with an electronic model that can more effectively communicate the many messages we have regarding the Parish and School.
- •No increase in tuition for the 2018-2019 School year.

Again, thanks to those providing feedback and thanks to all in the Parish for your continued generous support of the school and our mission to provide quality Catholic –based education. YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE!
