

Pillars of Lent: Prayer

As we begin Lent this week, we have something of an unusual coincidence: Ash Wednesday is also Valentine's Day, February 14th. So because of the Ash Wednesday fast, I guess we'll have to postpone the chocolate candies and Valentine's dinners. (The minimal rule is actually age limited. No meat for those 14 and older; fasting for those ages 18 to 59. That means only one full meal and, if necessary, two small meals which together are less than the full meal).

Fasting is probably the most well-known part of Lent – it is so well known it has become something of a hallmark of our Catholic identity. For example, fish fries and Catholics seem to go hand-in-hand. But the season of Lent actually has three pillars –

three key components – designed to help us share in the sacrifice of Christ, strip off unnecessary distractions from our relationship with Him, and grow in self-mastery so we can give ourselves more fully to Him and prepare to celebrate the Easter season with our hearts purified.

I'd like to touch briefly on all three pillars in my bulletin columns over the next few weeks as Lent begins: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The first of these, prayer, is probably the most neglected in the Lenten routine, because, to be honest, many Catholics have forgotten how to pray privately. They know the Mass and (maybe) pray grace before meals, but might not be great at praying any other time, because they don't know what to do.

It's actually not complicated. Some of our great saints just define it as lifting up our heart to God, or resting in God's presence and talking to him from the heart the same way you would talk to your best friend. We never run out of things to say to our best friend – or even when we're not speaking, we like to be with him or her. It should be the same with the Lord. We just tell Him what is on our hearts and minds.

It does get a little more complicated than that, because we tend to hide things from our friends – even our best friends sometimes. There is no reason to hide something from the Lord Who made us and knows us better than ourselves. So in prayer we pour out our thanksgiving for every good thing God gave us (most especially the gift of the holy Mass). We think about His goodness, His holiness, His humility in becoming a man like us and surrendering his life on the Cross to bring us to Heaven. We acknowledge our weakness and lack of love before Him, then ask for forgiveness, grace, and strength. We ask Him to meet the needs of ourselves, those we love, those who have no one to care for them. We ask Him to reveal His will to us: that is to give us His "marching orders" in what we should do with our lives. There is an almost inexhaustible supply of things to pray about.

For those who need something to "prime the pump" I suggest the traditional prayers that can be found on EWTN's website (the Catholic cable channel): ewtn.com/Devotionals/prayers/index.asp.

I also recommend, especially during Lent, that you start each day with five minutes of quiet prayer before you begin your morning routine and the busy-ness of the day kicks in. If you are given the vocation to family life, ask the Lord to help you love and serve your family the way He wants you to. For anyone, a "morning offering" is a great tradition. It is a dedication of the entire day to God's service and asking Him to keep you free from the dangers of sin. A traditional one can be found at the EWIN site above.

Finally, I want to recommend that all parishioners engage in the traditional practice of making an act of thanksgiving after Mass. This means taking a moment in quiet prayer right after Mass ends (after the closing hymn) and staying just a moment in the presence of Jesus Who is still with us in the tabernacle. Then, you can say a prayer in your own words, acknowledging your gratitude for what just

happened: Jesus made Himself present again to you in the full power of the sacrifice of the Cross on Calvary, so that the fullness of His divine life is poured out and received in His very Body and Blood. That is something we should ponder, instead of rushing off the instant Mass is over – or socializing immediately with our friends. (That can wait a few minutes for the atrium or outside the Church).




Lenten Reminders Fasting & Abstinence






