

## Holy Week through the eyes of St. John the Beloved

As we enter into this holiest of weeks, the scope, depth and the power of the mysteries we celebrate is overwhelming: Packed into this one week is the celebration of the institution of the holy priesthood and with it, the Mass, the high point of our whole Christian life; the suffering and agony of Christ in anguish, preparing to surrender His life on the Cross; the betrayal of Christ; His terrible death; His Resurrection from the dead and the revelation of the Glory of God the Father to His disciples. It is hard to know where to begin.

To narrow down our prayer, I think it is very helpful to try to place ourselves in the mindset of one of the characters of the Passion. I am going to suggest this week to pray through the eyes of St. John, often called "the beloved Disciple," because of his close relationship to the Lord. By tradition, he is the youngest of the Disciples, probably only a teenager, and we know him to be the most contemplative, as he lived until old age, reflecting profoundly on the mystery of Jesus' Cross and Resurrection and writing his magnificent gospel.

On Holy Thursday night, we can think of him at the Last Supper. The Scriptures tell us that he was so close to Jesus, that he lay his head upon His breast. So for this reason, traditional art has always depicted him there, right next to Jesus' side. I don't recognize the artist of this attached painting, but it is a beautiful



depiction of the very moment that Christ first gives His Apostles His own Body and Blood at the first Mass. John is next to the heart of Jesus, gazing at Christ present in the Sacred Host with deep wonder, awe, humility, and love. That says it all, because this is exactly how we should approach the privilege of sharing in every Holy Mass, as we gaze upon the sacred Host at the moment of consecration.

But there is even more depth to St. John. Because even though he was the youngest, he was also the most courageous. Of the other eleven Apostles, one of course betraved him, and ten ran from the Cross (with Peter famously denying Our Lord three times). But not John. Just as he had the tender love to stay close to Christ at the Last Supper, he had the tough love to remain close to Him at the horror of the Crucifixion, gazing up now – not at the Host – but rather at the tortured, crucified, bloody, and terribly disfigured Body of Christ on the Cross. It would be John, above all the other evangelists, who wrote so beautifully about receiving the true Body and Blood of Christ, partly because he saw both the Last Supper and the Crucifixion, and recognized that the very same lifeless body that lay limp on the bed of the Cross would be the one given to the world as the Bread of Life.

But John was not just there to witness the Crucifixion with his own eyes, as important as that was. The Lord also wanted him to be there for another reason: to give comfort, consolation, and strength to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who suffered in perfect Communion with the torment of her Son. Who can forget the hauntingly beautiful words of Jesus, gasping His last breaths from the Cross: Woman, behold your son! Son, behold your mother! Through these words of terrible love, Mary becomes the mother not only of John, but of all disciples of her Son for all generations. And we Christian disciples of every generation likewise gratefully receive her as our Mother.

Finally, it was John, who together with Peter, ran to the tomb first to see that the burial cloths were laying neatly wrapped up, and to witness that Jesus had truly risen from the dead, just as He promised, conquering sin and death. John reached the tomb first, even though he deferred to Peter, the first Pope, to go inside. In his youthful optimism and joy, he was the first to experience the empty tomb, the perpetual memorial of the Lord's saving power.

Let us pray through the intercession of St. John during this Holy Week, as we look through his eyes, that these events will become the very center of our existence, and our pathway to the unparalleled joy of eternal life.

r. Benedict O'Cinnsealaigh was born in Dublin, Ireland, 1964. His parents are Gerry and Martha, both living. He has four siblings, David, Gerard, Deborah and Stephanie all living in Dublin. His sisters are identical twins. He has 11 nieces and nephews. He is a graduate of Scoil Fursa (Catholic Elementary School, Dublin) and Belcamp College (Catholic High School, Dublin) as well as All Hallows College (Dublin), The University of St. Thomas Aguinas (Angelicum, Rome), and the International Marian Research Institute, University of Dayton (Ohio).

He was ordained to the priesthood in Ireland in 1993 and has a Doctorate in Theology. In 2011 he was appointed first recipient of the Daniel E. Pilarczyk Chair of Systematic Theology at the Athenaeum of Ohio. Fr.

Benedict arrived in the United States in 1993 and became a citizen of the United States in 2000. After serving at St. Albert the Great parish, Kettering, Ohio and Holy Angels parish, Sidney, Ohio, he was appointed by Archbishop Pilarczyk to the Athenaeum of Ohio and Mount St. Mary's Seminary in 2000 where he taught theology at the seminary, LPMP program and was director of the Permanent Deacon Formation Program. He was appointed President of the Athenaeum and Rector of Mount St. Mary's Seminary of the West in 2011.

Fr. Benedict has two dogs, Wiley (German Shepherd) and Blathene (Irish for Little Flower, she is a Border Collie) and a cat named Gail. Fr. Benedict said he was very happy and honored to be appointed by Archbishop Schnurr as pastor of Our Lady of Victory parish and he looks forward to arriving in early July and being a part of such a great parish.


